Father Tony Writes...

One quotation in Pope Leo's encyclical *Magnifica Humanitas* has surprised (and, at least in my case, delighted) a few people. It is from J.R.R. Tolkien. Here is the quote:

"It is not our part to master all the tides of the world, but to do what is in us for the succour of those years wherein we are set, uprooting the evil in the fields that we know, so that those who live after may have clean earth to till." (MH 213).

The words are those of Gandalf. The context is a meeting after the battle of the Pelennor Fields (*The Lord of the Rings* "The last Debate", Book five chapter IX). The battle is won, but they know there is more to do. In that context they are considering what they can do, against seemingly impossible odds, even though they know there are many things they cannot do.

The pope quotes this in a section entitled "We can all do our part" (MH 212-213). He cautions against the "subtle temptation ...", namely the thought that the problems are too big and we are too small, and that our choices, therefore, cannot make a difference".

Our readings this Sunday have something of a sombre note. Jeremiah is experiencing 'terror on every side', and while Jesus is encouraging his disciples not to fear, that implies there may be trouble ahead. The psalmist complains of suffering "taunts" and "shame". However, all the readings express confidence in God amidst the difficulties. And in our second reading we have the basis of that confidence – God's love for us, seen in Jesus Christ, which overcomes sin and evil.

In the book, Gandalf continues "What weather they shall have is not ours to rule", reminding us that we are but part of a larger story, and we cannot see where things will lead. All that is asked of us is that we be faithful in what we do, and trust the rest to God.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.
