St. Ignatius of Loyola – Feast Day 31st July

St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491–1556) was born Iñigo López de Loyola in the Basque region of northeast Spain. He grew up as a minor nobleman and courtier, who 'until the age of twenty six, was a man given to the vanities of the world . . . having a great and foolish desire to win fame'. After a life of swaggering, brawling and chasing women, he finally became a soldier thrilled by the ideals of chivalric romance.

9.00 In 1521, while leading the hopeless defence of Pamplona against the 9.30 French, Ignatius was seriously injured when a cannonball shattered both his 9:30 leg and his worldly ambitions. During his long and painful recovery at his 10.00 family's castle in Loyola, he asked for books to read about knights and noble 11.00 deeds but the only books available were a copy of The Life of Christ and a 11.00 Lives of the Saints. As he read these, he began to enjoy what he was reading. He had a vivid imagination and spent hours imagining himself doing 11.30 feats to rival and exceed what saints like Francis and Dominic had done before him. He also imagined courting 'a certain lady', and doing daring deeds to win her, achieving worldly honour and success in the process. One day, after weeks going from one enjoyable daydream to another, 'his eyes were opened a little' and he noticed that consistently the saintly daydreams left him joyful, consoled and at peace whereas the worldly daydreams left him unhappy, restless and discontented. He began to realise that God was moving his heart and attracting him through his saintly imaginings. Thus began his deep conversion and his divine education in spiritual discernment, Wed 6 how to notice, understand and act on Gods call deep within.

Ignatius left home and made a pilgrimage to the Benedictine monastery of Montserrat, where he confessed his sins (over three whole days!) and swapped his fine clothes with those of a beggar. He then spent almost a year in nearby Manresa living in poverty in a cave while helping the poor and sick in town, and spending hours each day in prayer. There he experienced intense inner struggles, especially with scruples concerning his past life. Inwardly he oscillated wildly between joyful consolation and despairing desolation, at one point coming close to suicide. He was being taught the hard way the reality of spiritual discernment, how to distinguish the voice of the Holy Spirit from that of the Enemy. There he began to note down his experiences and began to write his famous work, the Spiritual Exercises. This is an instruction manual on how to lead another person through a spiritually transforming thirty day retreat; it nurtures an intimate 6.00 knowledge and love for Jesus and a desire to follow him and work alongside 6.30 him in the world.

Ignatius went on from here to eventually spend ten years studying theology 9.00 in Paris in order to become a priest. He gathered a small group of faithful companions who together founded a new missionary order, the Society of Jesus. By the end of his life there were over a thousand Jesuits on mission


