Canon David Writes...

The words of the Gospel this Sunday may land uneasily on our ears, they run so counter to our way of thinking it is hard to imagine how they might enrich our family life, let alone our own self-esteem. When we put them into context our understanding is clearer. People living at that time would be dependent on the family not only to sustain life, but also to enrich their human experiences and maintain village life. So, to leave this arrangement to become a disciple of Jesus, on the move from place to place, travelling towards Jerusalem, would be extremely difficult. There is an echo of this difficulty elsewhere in the Gospel. Peter says to Jesus 'see, we have left everything and followed you.' He continues 'what then will we have?' (Matthew 19:27).

A similar sentiment is found in the Rule of St. Benedict which says, 'prefer nothing to Christ' and one way of responding to this call is to adapt to new circumstances. This change is to enable Jesus to be more easily heard through the Gospel and more clearly seen in the life and worship of our communities, including our schools. This desire to put Jesus first, because we need him, is the foundation stone of the change Bishop Richard will inaugurate next Sunday. He will celebrate Mass at St. John the Baptist Church at 5:30pm inaugurating the new Parish of Brighton and Hove. It is not possible to invite everyone to the Mass as there will not be enough space, but please keep this new step in our mission in your prayers. There will be some changes ahead as we adapt to meet new circumstances in the Church and see how Jesus wishes to meet the people of our time through the community of the Church. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we will be more able to help those without faith in Jesus to find that 'pearl of great price.' I hope each person will get involved, in a way that suits them, with the work and people that through the Church Jesus puts before us to serve them with his presence. Please keep the new Parish in your prayers.
