Canon David Writes...

I remember watching the film *Jesus of Nazareth* when it was shown as a miniseries on the television in what I have found out now was the year 1977! It doesn't seem that long ago. I was just a teenager at the time, and I can remember struggling to work out why Jesus had to die on the Cross. I also recall not looking forward to watching the scene as it seemed so violent and cruel. Compared with what came in a later film, *The Passion of the Christ*, by a different director, it wasn't that graphic. So, I understand if today's feast, the *Exaltation of the Holy Cross*, is not an easy celebration for us and causes us to watch, pray and think especially in the light of the suffering of so many around our world at this time.

As time has gone on and I have learnt more, gained more life experience, exercised ministry in the Church, prayed and meditated the mystery of God's love has opened up for me. Entering into the mystery of God's love is one reason for celebrating today's feast with as much openness and attention as we can manage. Jesus gave his life in this way out of love for God the Father and for each person, good and bad alike and this is what brings us salvation. It was an act of solidarity with our suffering, so that the crosses we each carry in life can be united with him in his love for God and for humanity. The mystery of God's love and the mystery of suffering are joined together in this feast, and their 'resolution' is revealed in the entrance antiphon of the Mass: '*We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.*' An invitation for us to trust in God.

In our part of the Church, we celebrate today Education Sunday, and this offers us an opportunity for us to pray for our Catholic schools, to thank staff, governors and other volunteers, especially parents, and perhaps think about offering our services and support to them. Through Catholic Education we gradually help children to learn about the mystery of God's love.

Finally, as mentioned last week, Bishop Richard inaugurates the new Parish of Brighton and Hove today with Mass at 5:30pm in St. John the Baptist Church. Any parishioner can attend and would be welcome. Please pray for the new parish.

Churches Together calls for prayer for peace in the Middle East

21st September 2025

Churches Together in England (CTE) is encouraging churches and partner organisations to pray for peace in the Middle East on Sunday, 21 September. The General Secretary of Churches Together in England, Bishop Mike Royal, said: "There is a growing consensus amongst churches and Christian organisations engaged in the Middle East that it's high time we act together as one... On 21 September, Churches Together in England is supporting Christian Aid and other partners [to] encourage congregations across the nation to hold a minute's silence to pray for an end to hostilities, unfettered humanitarian access to Gaza, the release of Israeli hostages, and for work to continue to secure a lasting peace." The Times of Israel recently published details of a letter signed by 1,000 rabbis to Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu - the letter highlighted a "deep concern for the fate of both the Palestinians in Gaza, the Israeli hostages, and everyone else in both Israel and Palestine who are caught up in this horrific war." An article on the CTE website continues: "We are witnessing the devastating escalation of violence in Gaza and the West Bank. The cries of Palestinian church leaders for peace and solidarity have echoed across the global Church, urging us to respond with clarity, compassion, and conviction. As Christian agencies rooted in faith and justice, we believe the gravity of this moment demands a visible, united Christian witness—one that speaks to our shared commitment to peace, reconciliation, and the dignity of all people." *You can find out more about CTE's call to prayer for peace and access resources, on the charity's website.*

St Carlo Acutis

Last Sunday 7th September, Pope Leo XIV declared London-born Carlo Acutis the Catholic Church's first Millennial saint. Acutis, a computer prodigy who died in 2006 at the age of 15, is a real saint for our times. His commitment to the fundamental truths of Catholicism, particularly his deep devotion to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist,

are an inspiration to this and future generations of young people. The ceremony, Pope Leo's first saint-making Mass, drew tens of thousands of attendees, including many millennials and young families. Bishop Nicholas Hudson, Episcopal Secretary for the Bishops' Conference, has written a personal reflection on Carlo Acutis and explains his close ties with the Catholic Church in this country. 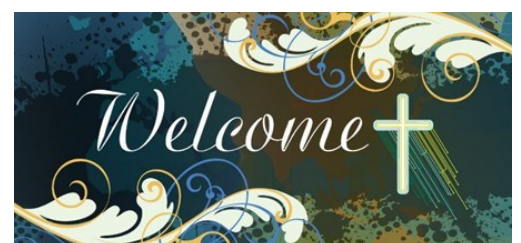
