Canon David Writes...

The Gospel this Sunday begins with the Apostles saying to the Lord 'Increase our faith!' These are words that each one of us could turn into a prayer. We could also reflect if this cry reflects the deepest desire of our hearts. Perhaps this is what the reply of Jesus is asking us to consider. He says: 'If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you'. A mustard seed is small, but it is active, and it grows, so even if we think we have a small amount of faith in our hearts it will grow, and through this God will be active in our lives and in our world. For our part we are called to nourish our faith through prayer and action.

So, we can cooperate with the gift of faith, which comes from God, by our active Christian service both within the Church and outside its institutional boundaries. The words used in the gospel can seem demanding and ungrateful. But we can also hear them as words of encouragement to make our service of God a priority in our lives. This is not about forgetting to take proper care of ourselves, but to regard our Christian service as important and a call from God. In the words of the Gospel: '...we have only done our duty.' This to me is the key point, that we are all called to be active in service according to vocational state and considering our circumstances in life such as health and ability.

As we enter the month of October, we bring to the Lord the needs of those around the world, with CAFOD Family Fast day this weekend and World Mission Sunday on 19th October. Also, next Sunday is Prisoners' Sunday which is an opportunity to pray for those in prison and to support their families. October is also a month to remember Our Lady, praying for her intercession so that our faith and action may increase!

St Mary's currently has a Governor Associate Member vacancy, and we thought it might be of interest to the Parish. This is an exciting opportunity to contribute to the life of our school and help us continue to grow and thrive. Please see below for further details. Associate Members are not full governors but play an important part in the work of the governing body, offering expertise and guidance to support decision-making. If you or someone you know has the relevant experience and would like to make a positive difference to our school community, please speak with Mrs Clayton or Mrs Ryan.

 There are currently vacancies on the Governing Board for one Parent Governor and two Foundation Governors. Foundation Governors do not need to be education experts. The most effective governors listen, think, and ask questions. There is no magic formula about what makes a perfect Foundation Governor, they come from all occupations and all ages. Foundation Governors play an especially key role in Catholic Schools; the role is diverse, rewarding, challenging, and fulfilling allowing post holders to share their time, skills, and talents within a school setting. You will be encouraged to attend training sessions and will be supported in your role. The average Foundation Governor position will take up about 10-12 hours per month though this can vary depending on the school calendar or events, such as Ofsted inspections. The time commitment includes the minimum requirement of attending three full governor meetings per year.
