Canon Colin Writes:

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus telling the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector, and it forces us to question our own attitude. Most of us know people who constantly bore us with talk of their achievements often ignoring the success of others. The key is self-awareness having the courage to see ourselves as others see us. I'm reminded of an article I once read.

A news reporter asked St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa) if she had ever been tempted to be proud. Mother Theresa retorted with a smile, "Proud about what?" The reporter replied, "Why, about the wonderful things you have been doing for the poorest of the poor!" Then came her answer, "I never knew I had done anything, because it was God who worked in and through my sisters and volunteers."

True humility differentiates a saint from a sinner. If we are proud of our talents, our family connections, our reputation, or our achievements in life, today's Gospel tells us that we need Jesus to rid us of our pride and make us truly humble.

SVP report, "The Hidden Crisis of In-Work Poverty – A Frontline Perspective"

Members and supporters of the Catholic Union joined a "Pub Talk" earlier this month given by Kate Nightingale, CEO of St Vincent de Paul Society (SVP). Chaired by journalist Catherine Pepinster, Kate's talk highlighted the challenges and complexities of invisible poverty.

The discussion focused on several interrelated issues including in-work poverty, refugees and asylum seekers, mental health and loneliness. Much debate centred on a recent SVP report, "The Hidden Crisis of In-Work Poverty – A Frontline Perspective", which draws on first-hand accounts from more than 200 SVP frontline workers and volunteers who support individuals and families facing in-work poverty.

The report shines a light on how many people, despite being in work, remain trapped in poverty and must choose between essentials such as fuel or food. Related issues were also discussed, such as instances of workers being exploited and being unable, or too afraid to, access support services and the impact of loneliness and disenfranchisement - particularly amongst young adults.

The SVP supports communities across England and Wales, with more than 30 groups (called Conferences) active in churches across our Diocese. Speaking during the Catholic Union event, Kate Nightingale said: "The SVP is about turning concern into action, our staff and members are committed to seeking those in need and tackling poverty and hardship in all its forms. Invisible poverty can be difficult to detect, but through our networks we can take practical steps to help alleviate it. We must not lose heart but instead act wherever we see need."



The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: "God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get." But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.'
