
Sunday 18th January 2026, Second Sunday in Ordinary time, Year A. Weekdays: Week 2, Psalter Week 2

Canon Colin writes

Our Christmas celebrations are finally over, and we return to Ordinary Time to put into practice all that we have seen and heard. In today's Gospel we hear how John the Baptist recognised Jesus as the Lamb of God. When John's parents died, he may well have been still too young to be on his own. Zechariah and Elizabeth had been very old when John was born, so that would not have been a surprise, but apparently nothing was done to prepare for it, just the same. According to tradition, the rest of the family had gone north to Nazareth because of political problems, and John, left alone, was taken in by a group of old men who lived in a little village down by the Dead Sea. The place was called Qumran, and the men were known as the Essenes. No one agrees just where the Essenes came from originally, but most agree that they had come to Qumran to get away from the "corruption" they believed was taking place in the Temple in Jerusalem (a response to overwhelming corruption in secular life, copied during the following centuries, particularly in the second century by the Desert Fathers and Mothers, and in the Middle Ages, by those who founded and lived in the monasteries throughout Europe). You could say of both groups, that they were "religious fanatics" — or, more accurately, saints-in-the making, who lived lives of penance and prayer and spent the days and nights copying Scripture with its prophetic scrolls about how one day, God was going to send His Messiah and flush that filth right out of Jerusalem. Since many of them were unmarried, it was common for them to "adopt" homeless children and raise them, teaching them to continue the Essene lifestyle. One of those homeless children may well have been the young boy, John. Years later, when he appears just a few miles north of Qumran, he preaches, "Repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand!" These are Essene words, pure and simple. — But even when he became a popular preacher, John still had the humility to acknowledge and introduce Jesus as "the Lamb of God" and the expected Messiah.

Lepra seeks to provide better detection and treatment to advocate for those without a voice, to challenge prejudice wherever it exists, to help provide sustainable healthcare in partnership with local communities.
