Fr Tony Writes: Happy or Blessed?

With the shift to the English Standard Version as the text for our readings, the Beatitudes have gone back to the more traditional blessed, whereas for the last 40+ years we have heard that those who are poor in spirit etc. are happy, the Jerusalem Bible's translation of the Greek word *Makarios*. Most people welcome this change, and generally I prefer it too. None the less I want to put a word in for happy as a translation which has its merits!

The word blessed does not carry much emotional content. In effect, it says, 'you may feel sad/poor/oppressed now, but don't worry, it will be all right in the end'. There is nothing wrong with that message, but the beatitudes don't just speak of the future. They also address the present: 'Theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven', 'Rejoice and be glad [now!], for your reward is great in heaven. The statement 'happy are those who mourn' is meant to shock us by its apparent paradox. By mourning Jesus is not simply referring to grief at the loss of a loved one, he is referring to the sense of sadness at the many things that are wrong in the world. The fact that we are saddened shows us what we truly care about. We care about our world and the people in it. If the things we see and hear did not at times make us want to weep, we would be very unhappy people indeed.

Even if we have an unshakable faith that God, in his providence will ensure that 'all will be well', as he assured Mother Julian of Norwich when she considered the woes of the world, none the less we may still weep, as Jesus wept at the death of Lazarus or lamented over Jerusalem.

Children's Liturgy at Sacred Heart, St Peter's, & St Theresa's – Can You Help? Children's Liturgy is a valued and much-loved part of Sunday Mass at Sacred Heart, St Peter's, and St Theresa's, and we are looking for a few more volunteers to help us continue offering this ministry to our children and families.

What is Children's Liturgy? During Sunday Mass, when the congregation sits for the Liturgy of the Word, children are invited to go to a nearby space with trained leaders. They return to the church for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Children's Liturgy is not a separate service or Sunday school. It is part of the Mass itself, helping young children hear and respond to the Gospel in ways that connect with their everyday lives, so they can participate more fully in the celebration of the Eucharist at their own level. Children of all ages up to secondary school are very welcome. Those of secondary school age are encouraged to remain in the Mass. Children's Liturgy runs during term time only.



Safeguarding and support To ensure a safe and welcoming environment, there must always be at least two adults present. If there are not enough adults, parents may be asked to help, and occasionally the session may not be able to run.

At St Theresa's, we are blessed with experienced and committed leaders, including three teachers, and we would love to have a few more adults to support them. This could be simply being the second adult present, or, if you feel called to it, leading a session after shadowing an experienced leader. Full support is always provided. Having more volunteers means each person helps less often, making it manageable and enjoyable for everyone. Please be reassured that you only need to volunteer at the church you attend, you are not expected to help at the other churches. Thank you for considering supporting this important ministry and helping our children grow in faith.
