Good Shepherd Sunday

Canon David Writes...

As we celebrate what we call 'Good Shepherd' Sunday many of us will be thinking about when we will receive news of an appointment of a Bishop for our own Diocese. We do not know when this will happen, but we do know that our prayer is a vital part of the process of discernment and enquiry that is being undertaken during these weeks and months. Unlike the secular world these issues are not rushed but have the character of a 'spiritual deliberation' in which allowing time and space for the Holy Spirit to work is greatly valued and received gratefully. This Sunday is also a day of prayer for vocations, recognising everyone's baptismal call to holiness, which then leads to the particular vocations. These vocations of the single and married state, ordination as a priest or a deacon or to religious and consecrated life, are all at the service of the Church and humanity.

This sense of vocation or calling begins with prayer when in the silence of our hearts we are able to hear the voice of Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, leading us gently into his service. Pope Leo XIV has issued a letter for this 63rd World Day of Prayer For Vocations, which reflects on this need for interiority. In this letter he has written: In the Gospel of John, Jesus describes himself as the "good shepherd." This expression refers to a shepherd who is perfect, authentic and exemplary, inasmuch as he is ready to give his life for his sheep, thus revealing God's love. He is the Shepherd who draws us to himself, whose gaze reveals that life is truly beautiful when one follows him. Neither the eyes of the body nor aesthetic sensibilities alone are sufficient to recognise this beauty; rather, contemplation and interiority are required. Only the one who pauses, listens, prays and welcomes the Shepherd's gaze can say with confidence: 'I trust him; life with him can truly be beautiful. I want to walk this path of beauty.'



Our vocation to holiness is beautiful, an inspiring message to pass on.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel John 10:1-10

At that time: Jesus said, 'Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in by another way, that man is a thief and a robber. But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. To him the gatekeeper opens. The sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. A stranger they will not follow, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers.' This figure of speech Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So Jesus again said to them, 'Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.'

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.
