### Fr Tony Writes...

The Holy Trinity is one of the central beliefs of Christianity. It teaches that there is one God who exists eternally as three distinct persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This does not mean that there are three gods. Rather, the doctrine expresses the mystery that God is one in essence while revealed in three persons. For many believers, the Trinity helps explain how God can be both beyond the world and actively present within it. The idea is not simple, but it has shaped Christian worship, prayer, and theology for centuries.

The word "Trinity" does not appear directly in the Bible, but the teaching is rooted in Scripture. The New Testament speaks of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit together in important passages such as Matthew 28:19 and 2 Corinthians 13:13. Early Christians reflected on these texts as they tried to understand the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and the ongoing work of the Spirit. Over time, Church leaders developed the formal doctrine of the Trinity, especially through debates and councils in the fourth century, in order to defend the belief that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are each fully divine.

The Father is often associated with creation and loving authority, the Son with salvation through Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit with guidance, comfort, and spiritual renewal. These are not separate actions by separate gods, but the united work of the one God. The Trinity also shows that relationship and love belong to God's very nature.

The Holy Trinity remains a profound mystery, but it is also a source of meaning and devotion for Christians. Rather than being a puzzle to solve completely, it is understood as a truth about who God is. The doctrine emphasizes unity, love, and divine presence, and it continues to influence Christian belief, worship, and identity today.

St Augustine writes of the Eucharist: "If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. 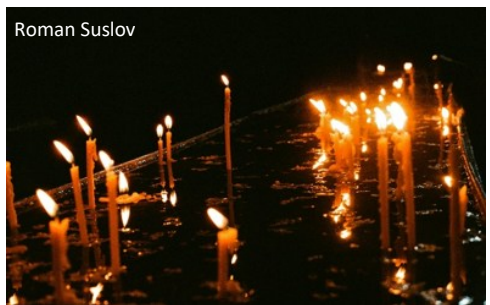
