### Fr Paul Writes...

This Sunday we celebrate the great feast of the Body and Blood of Christ: literally a feast.

Of course, we celebrate Christ's gift of his body and blood in every celebration of the Eucharist, but the fact that we have a special festival each year emphasises the central importance of the Eucharist in our Christian life. It might be said that people go to Mass because they are Catholic. It is, perhaps, truer to say that people are Catholic because they go to Mass.

Each local Catholic community is, above all, a eucharistic community. In a very real sense, we are what we eat and drink, nourished to be the continuing presence of Christ in the world. The Church describes the Eucharist as 'the source and summit of our faith.' It is the highest expression of what we are about as Christians, and the source from which all that we believe and do is derived - to be the real presence of Christ in the world. The Eucharist, along with Baptism and Confirmation, is one of the Sacraments of Initiation through which we become full members of the Church, taking on the responsibility of being the Church in the world. This is why almost all major celebrations of the Church take place within the context of the Mass.

In the Eucharist we share in 'the one bread and the one cup' and so become 'one body in Christ.' This is why the Church insists that we should all receive Holy Communion in the same way, in this country in the ancient and traditional way, standing and in the hand, making with our hands, as St Cyril of Jerusalem said in the 4th century, 'a throne to receive our King.' Thus, in our actions, we show our commitment to being 'one in Christ,' in communion with Christ and each other. In the strength of that 'oneness' Christ challenges us to go out and show God's love to the world.

### St Theresa's & St Georges: Celebrating Service and Ministry On the Feast of Corpus Christi

St Augustine writes of the Eucharist: "If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond "Amen" ("yes, it is true!") and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, "the Body of Christ" and respond "Amen." Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your *Amen* may be true." So this Sunday we will be celebrating the Body of Christ, present in the Eucharist and present in his gathered people, the Body of Christ, the Church. In doing so we will be celebrating the many different roles that people take up, all the forms of service and ministry that help us to, as Augustine puts it, make our Amen true. We will also be offering the opportunity for people to share more fully, or in new ways, in this great calling to be Christ present in the world.

### First Holy Communion at St Peter's & Sacred Heart

June is the month when the children who have been preparing since last November receive their First Holy Communion. This will take place at the 11:30am Mass on 7th, 14th and 21st June at St Peter's. These Masses will be very busy, and we will be reserving one bench for each family who have a child receiving their First Holy Communion at that Mass.

Sacred Heart will celebrate their services on 14th and 21st June at the 9:30 Masses.
