Fr Tony Writes...

'We do not know what to pray for as we ought'

As a priest, I am often asked about prayer, in particular people wondering if they are 'doing it right'. I think the first thing to note is that we are all beginners in prayer! And while I have had plenty of practice over the years, I still feel very much a novice much of the time.

The next thing to note is that prayer is not about a 'technique'. Rather it is an expression of a relationship. So, we do not have to worry about 'getting it right'. As St Paul points out, prayer is actually an action of the Spirit in us, so however clumsy or inadequate it feels, God works through it. That is not to say that there is not a place for rhythm and discipline. It is good to have set times when we focus more directly on prayer and have some sort of basic ritual. A particular chair. Time just allowing us to focus on God, particular prayers that help with that, etc. But once we have done that, what happens next is up to God to a large extent. God knows what is deep in our hearts. God does not need us to articulate it perfectly!

What about distractions? They will come and are just a part of being human! Sometimes they can give us an idea of what we should be praying for or about. Other times they are just trivialities. There are a couple of things to note here. First, do not worry! The temptation when we recognise that we have been distracted is to focus on the fact that we have become distracted and then to get distracted about having been distracted! The better approach is to thank God that we have recognised the distraction, to note it (maybe even write it down if it concerns something we need to do later), and then return gratefully to our prayer. Second, if we have given time to prayer that in itself is a gift to God, even if our minds were all over the place. Our bodies were there even if our minds were not!

Which leads me to a final point. Prayer is not just about what happens in our head. As Catholics we take various postures for prayer, and we sometimes use physical

objects, such as a rosary, or particular movements, such as the Sign of the Cross. Paul speaks of 'groanings too deep for words', a kind of whole-body experience. Sometimes we may have a deep emotional response in prayer. Sometimes none at all. It is different for all. What matters is that we are earnestly seeking communion with God, who, in the Spirit, knows us better than we know ourselves, and we leave the rest to God.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel — Matthew 13:24-43

At that time: Jesus put another parable before the crowd, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field, but while his men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared also. And the servants of the master of the house came and said to him, "Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have weeds?" He said to them, "An enemy has done this." So the servants said to him, "Then do you want us to go and gather them?" But he said, "No, lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. Let both grow together until the harvest, and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, 'Gather the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.' " ' "

He put another parable before them, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches.'

He told them another parable. 'The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened.'

All these things Jesus said to the crowds in parables; indeed, he said nothing to them without a parable. This was to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet: 'I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter what has been hidden since the foundation of the world.'

Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples came to him, saying, 'Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field.' He answered, 'The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world, and

the good seed is the sons of the kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will gather out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all law-breakers, and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear.'

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.
