Canon David writes...

The news this past week has had some bleak moments and here I am thinking of the warnings given to us by two people working closely with the development of Artificial Intelligence (AI). If you do not know about this, you can consult your news feeds or ask someone else. I have been surprised that this warning was greeted so passively. Maybe people shrug their shoulders and think there is nothing they can do. Perhaps they don't believe it or think that whatever they do will not make any difference. These attitudes are not those held by Pope Leo nor is he likely to agree with them given what he wrote in his latest Encyclical Letter Magnifica Humanitas. The subtitle says it is 'On safeguarding the Human Person in the time of Artificial Intelligence.'

Pope Leo puts before us two biblical images. The first is the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11: 1-9) which is an act of pride that ends in disaster. The other is the rebuilding of the walls of Jerusalem (Nehemiah 1-2) where the returning exiled people work together under the guidance of the Lord to build something good for all and everyone takes part. So, taking this latter approach, AI could be a force for good as the Pope recognises: "Scientific discoveries are talents entrusted to humanity that they may bear fruit (cf. Mt 25: 14-30). Technology has the power to heal, connect, educate and protect our common home; but it can divide, exclude and generate new forms of injustice."

So, Pope Leo puts before us a challenge: "We are to be servants of the coming kingdom, instead of lords of towers destined for ruin. I ask everyone to abandon the construction of yet another Tower of Babel and join forces in building up the common good so that humanity will never lose its beauty, and the world once again will come to recognise the human heart as the place where God desires to dwell." Now is the time to be more active as Catholics, contacting our politicians and putting forward our views. Through organisations like Citizens UK and the Church's own synodal process the young people in our Catholic schools have made their voices heard. Could we join our voices to theirs in making our world and locality better places?

Gospel — Matthew 18:21-35

At that time: Peter came up and said to Jesus, 'Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven.
'Therefore the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began to settle, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. And since he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." And out of pity for him, the master of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But when that same servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him, he began to choke him, saying, "Pay what you owe." So his fellow servant fell down and pleaded with him, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you." He refused and went and put him in prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their master all that had taken place. Then his master summoned him and said to him, "You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?" And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until

he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart.'

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
