Evangelii Gaudium Sunday

Fr Paul writes...

This Sunday, Home Mission Sunday, has, in recent years, been known as *Evangelii Gaudium Sunday* from the title of Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, meaning *The Joy of the Gospel*, published in 2013 and widely seen as setting the tone of his papacy. In it Francis reminds us that evangelisation, sharing the good news of Jesus Christ, is an essential part of being a Christian. In Matthew's Gospel one of Jesus' last instructions to us is to 'make disciples of all the nations' (Matt 28:19). Francis reminds us that "We cannot forget that evangelisation is first and foremost about preaching the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus Christ or who have always rejected him. Many of these are quietly seeking God, led by a yearning to see his face... Christians have the duty to proclaim the Gospel without excluding anyone." (EG 14).

It is becoming clear that there is renewed interest in Christianity and in the Church, particularly amongst young people, perhaps 'led by a yearning to see' the face of Christ. As Christians we are all called to show that face of Christ to them. To be attractive to others it needs to be a face that shows our joy in God revealed to us in the life and teaching of Christ in the Gospel and our experience of living that joy.

If we believe that God loves us so much that his Son was prepared to die on the cross for us, we should be filled with joy and live out our trust in that joy in our everyday lives and in our encounters with others. Unless we show that our faith brings us joy, why should anyone else be attracted to faith? Today, as we focus on the Church's mission here at home in our own circumstances, we should pray that we will each allow ourselves to be drawn ever more deeply into the joy of the Gospel and be able to share that joy with others.

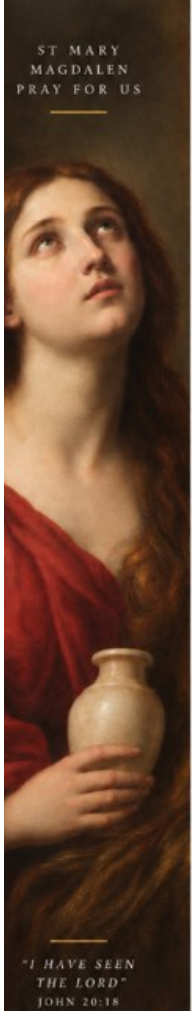

Gospel — Matthew 20:1-16

At that time: Jesus told his disciples this parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. After agreeing with the labourers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market-place, and to them he said, "You go into the vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give you." So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. And he said to them, "Why do you stand here idle all day?" They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You go into the vineyard too." 'And when evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his steward, "Call the labourers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last, up to the first." And when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, saying, "These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat." But he replied to one of them, "Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? Take what

belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?" So the last will be first, and the first last.'

Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages.
