Those Covid Rules in full (updated):

- The capacity of the church is 100 people: two people per bench, spaced at one metre apart, and one person per chair. (Families can sit together.)
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and exit.
- Please observe the one way system: up the middle, down the sides, especially at Holy Communion.
- There are no hymn books or Mass books.
- If you take a newsletter, please take it home with you.
- You are free to bring your own Missal with you.
- There is no Holy Water in the stoups.
- There is no congregational singing.
- The Church doors are to remain open to ventilate the building.
- Mass is shorter than usual.
- There are no Bidding Prayers.
- There is no procession of the Gifts to the altar and no passing around of the collection baskets.
- There is no sign of peace.
- The collection will be taken as you leave the church.
- Holy Communion will be received under one kind only.
- Communion must be given silently, avoiding any physical contact.
- Please remove your mask (if wearing one) to receive Holy Communion.
- As you leave do not to linger in doorways or other 'choke points'.
- Once Mass is over the Church will be closed and cleaned.
- People are urged not to come to the sacristy before and after Mass, unless they are servers or sacristans.
- Face coverings are mandatory for all who are not exempt.
- The Bishops also urge readers to wear disposable gloves.

All Hall users please note the following:

- The Hall has to be well ventilated. The windows in the loos are to be kept open. When the Hall is in use the street door must be propped open. Windows to be closed when you leave.
- After you have used the chairs, place them stacked in place with a note on them saving when they were used. When you use chairs, pick the stack that has been used least recently. This is to ensure that the use of chairs is rotated.
- The capacity of the Hall is 16 people.
- Enter the Hall from the link; leave by the street doors; please respect this one way system.
- Do not form gueues by the loos.
- Children must be accompanied when they use the loos.
- Please use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Please wash your hands after using the loos.
- Please respect social distancing.
- At Hall events, the organisers need to note who is attending, for any track and trace measures. These names and contact details must be kept for three weeks.
- Every time the Hall is used, it has to be cleaned afterwards.

Today is Solemnity of All Saints. On this day we celebrate all the saints, including all those who have never been formally canonised and who now live in the presence of God. Today is a joyful day which should cheer us all up after the clocks going back and the start of encroaching long nights. The first reading from the book of Revelation speaks of 'a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language' who now stand before the Lamb where they intercede for us. The Gospel is that of the Beatitudes, which sums up the way the Saints lived, each in their different ways. Let us remember today the universal call to holiness, and let us also remember the importance of invoking the saints, asking them for help in our daily struggles.

This Sunday is we are holding the

delayed retiring collection for World Communications Day. Next Sunday will be the collection for the Cathedral Maintenance Fund Both collections will be taken in

baskets at the front of the Church, while the usual parish collection will be taken while you leave.

Monday is the important

Commemoration of All Souls, popularly known as the Day of the Dead, a day on which we pray for those who have died and are still in a state of Purgation, that they may be released from their sins and have the vision of God. Mass will be at 10am. A plenary ("full") indulgence, which is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church on All Souls' Day. One should say one Our Father and the Apostles Creed in the visit to the church and one Our Father and one Hail Mary for the Holy Father's intentions, worthily receive Holy Communion (ideally on the same day if you can get to Mass), make a sacramental confession within 20 days of All Souls' Day and be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin (otherwise, the indulgence is partial, not plenary, "full"). A partial indulgence can be obtained by visiting a cemetery and praving for the departed, on any day in November, extended to the whole month this year.

As you may know, Fr Alexander has had to self-isolate on his return from holiday. He will be back in circulation from Friday 6 November. The parish office is open as usual. Many thanks to Canon Heaney, Fr Alan Sharpe, and Fr Sebastian for covering daily Masses, and to Fr Paul for covering the weekends.

Liturgical Notes:

November is the month dedicated to praver for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. On days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate the Daily Mass for the Dead. Monday 2 November is the commemoration of All Souls.

Tuesday 3 November is the feast of Saint Martin de Porres.

Wednesday 4 November is the feast of Saint Charles Borromeo.

The Blessing of the Graves will take place this year on Sunday 8 November in Hove Cemetery at 2pm. You are invited to meet with Fr Alexander at that time at the top left corner in the northern or new part of the cemetery. A brief service of prayer will be held there, and then Fr Alexander will proceed to bless individual graves at the direction of friends and family members of the deceased. Please note that other parish priests will be doing similar things in various places, but please contact other parishes about their arrangements, not Saint Peter's.

Thanks to Fr Alexander having to self-isolate, we shall not be having the 'extra' Mass on the commemoration of All Souls for the late Fr Albert, but be having this on Monday 9 November instead at the same time of 7.30pm. Please adjust your diaries. Afterwards we shall have a drink in the Hall in memory of dear Fr Albert.

This Sunday, 1 November, the Oriental Orthodox are holding a Divine Liturgy for a deceased member of their Church. It will start at 5pm.

The funeral of the late Liam Liddy will take place on Tuesday 10 November at 11.30am at the Church of the Sacred Heart. Burial will follow at Hove cemetery. The funeral Mass will be celebrated by Monsignor Benny O'Shea. Liam died on 8th October at the age of 86. Let us pray for his family and the repose of his soul. Please note that numbers at the funeral are limited, but you can follow the service online via the Sacred Heart website.

Let us pray for the repose of the soul of Annette Buttcher, who died on 17 October, and whose funeral will be here on Thursday 12 November at 1pm, followed by burial at Hove Cemetery. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and for the comfort of her family.

Our Parish Social Club meets on Friday at 1.30pm in the Hall. This Friday it will be fun and games. On Friday 13 November, Fr Alexander has been invited to give a little talk on his recent visit to Italy. On Friday 20 November, it will be bingo. All are welcome. Social Dancing is now taking place on a Tuesday from 1.30pm to 3.30pm. All are welcome.

Registration forms for First Holy Communion (normally done in year three) and for Confirmation (normally done in year ten) are at the back of the Church. The closing date for registration for both courses is 6 December. Both courses will start in January. Because of restricted space and resources, we regret that will not be accepting registrations from outside the parish. In addition, we are unable to accept late registrations. As in previous years, Fr Alexander will visit all the candidates at home when they have registered.

Are you thinking of becoming a Catholic? Are you an adult baptised Catholic who has never been confirmed? Are you a baptised Christian who wishes to be received into full Communion with the Catholic Church? Are you an adult who has never been baptised? If so, you need to speak to Fr Alexander to explore your further Christian initiation. We aim to start after Christmas, so the sacraments can be administered at Easter. Are you a child past your seventh birthday, who wishes to be baptised? Are you a Catholic adolescent who wishes to make your first Holy Communion and Confirmation but had missed the usual year for these things? If so, please come and see Fr Alexander too.

From the diocese: Many of you will have heard that St John's Seminary in Wonersh is to close in its present form. The Seminary has served the Church for 130 years and there is great sadness that formation must now end at the site. Unfortunately, there was no new intake this September. With the seminarian body numbering just 17 the community is small, with the building and staffing costs too high to sustain. Arrangements have been made for the remaining seminarians to join the community at Allen Hall, Chelsea in September 2021. Archbishop John Wilson and Bishop Richard are committed to providing priestly formation that will serve the people of our Dioceses and parishes into the future. St John's will remain a legal entity so that

consideration can be given to the ways in which the tradition of priestly formation established at Wonersh in 1891 will continue. The Trustees of St John's are extremely grateful to rectors, staff and seminarians, past and present, and to all those who have supported the Seminary over the years. We ask our Diocesan church family to pray for vocations to the priesthood, keeping our seminarians in their thoughts and prayers over the coming months.
