This Sunday is Low Sunday, the Octave Day of Easter, and also Divine Mercy Sunday. It is called Low Sunday because the ceremonies are a little muted after the many ceremonies of Holy Week and Easter, in order to give the faithful, the musicians and the clergy a break. It concludes the Easter Octave, the week of celebrations of the Resurrection of the Lord, though the Easter season continues until the feast of the Ascension on 13 May and Pentecost which falls on 23 May. Today is a day of devotion to the Divine Mercy, as

popularised by Saint Faustina. (We have a picture in the Sacred Heart chapel.) Today is also a special day for the Catholics of India, as the gospel is about the faith of Saint Thomas, who was the apostle of India.

The Gospel today recounts Saint

Thomas's confession of faith in Jesus as the Son of God, Risen from the dead, after his original profession of doubt. We are also told of Jesus' commission to the apostles to forgive sins. In the first reading we are told that the early Christians were united in heart and soul.All of these things – the forgiveness of sins, the profession of faith and the living of community – are very important to us today.

Today we are holding a table top sale, for the Hall refurbishment fund, outside in the street, keeping our social distance and enjoying the fresh air, and hoping for nice weather. Goods can be dropped at any time. The sale will run from 9.15 until after the 11.15am Mass.

This coming Sunday at the parish in Shoreham, there is a Divine Mercy service as follows: 3pm Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Divine Mercy Chaplet with Confessions available.
