This Sunday is the Sixth Sunday of the Year. The prayers and readings for today can be found in the yellow books on page 136. The first reading is from the book of Ecclesiasticus, in which we are exhorted to keep the commandments of God. The Gospel is from Saint Matthew, and contains Jesus' exhortation to keep the commandments not just outwardly, but in our hearts as well. (We shall read the short version of the Gospel.) Both these readings emphasise the continuing importance of the Ten Commandments, the Law given by God on Mount Sinai.

Last Sunday, after a very long pause, Children's Liturgy at the 10am Mass resumed. It is for children from year minus 1 to First Holy Communion age. Children and parents who wish to take part will be called up after the Gloria and Opening Prayer, and will then process into the Hall. They will return for the Offertory. Many thanks to the volunteers who have made this possible. Children's Liturgy is every Sunday, irrespective of school holidays, except in the months of April, August and December.

This Sunday is the collection for the Lourdes Fund, which subsidises those who wish to go on the diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes. Please put your donation in an envelope and place it in the normal collection OR make a donation to the retiring collection as you leave the Church. We will have a collection on a future Sunday of the victims of the earthquake in Syria and Turkey. The needs of those affected by the earthquake will be felt for some time to come, sadly.

The Monday Tai Chi group that meets in the Hall has Raised £100 for Ukraine, which we have donated to the DEC Ukraine appeal. Well done to them! This brings our fundraising for Ukraine to £3,745.50.

Confessions are heard after Mass each Friday, that is, starting at 10.30am, and every Saturday before the evening Mass, from 5.15 to 5.45pm.

Liturgical notes

We are now in Ordinary Time, when the vestments are green, unless there is a feast. February is dedicated to the Holy Family. On days when there is no feast, we shall celebrate a Mass for the Sick.

- Tuesday is the feast of Saints Cyril, monk, and Methodius, bishop, patron saints of Europe.
- Friday is the feast of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order.

Brace yourselves! Lent is coming, and begins on Ash Wednesday, 22 February. Make sure you get those Ashes, so that you can have the best possible start to Lent. On Ash Wednesday Mass will be at 10am, and the Ashes will be imposed at that Mass. In order to enable as many people to get the Ashes as possible, there will be a Liturgy of the Word (not Mass) with the Imposition of Ashes at 7pm. This will last about 20 minutes maximum. In addition, there are going to be two Assemblies at Cottesmore, to enable every child in the school to have the Ashes. What do the Ashes mean? In Old Testament times, people would put ashes on their heads as a sign of penance and sorrow for their sins, and to show that they were fasting. The Ashes we use (made from the Palms used on Palm Sunday), are a sign that we wish to repent, to turn over a new leaf, and that we want to do this throughout Lent and in preparation for Easter.

Now is the time to be thinking of what to do for Lent. Traditionally, the faithful are called to fasting, almsgiving, prayer, and penance.

- Fasting: think of what food or drink you can give up. This is usually some sort of luxury (chocolate, cake, alcohol, etc). In addition, you can also renounce something that you spent too much time on, and choose to restrict television, the internet, screen time, or sleep.
- Almsgiving: you could donate to the foodbank, help some financially challenged people you know directly, or give to the collection for Lenten alms that we will hold one Sunday, which will be used to boost the parish poor fund or for some other charitable purpose. You can combine fasting with almsgiving by undertaking the Cafod Family Fast day on 3rd March.

- Prayer: the best prayer is attendance at Mass on Sundays and during the week. In addition, we will have the Stations of the Cross on Fridays. One can pray at home or privately, by saying the Rosary, and meditating on the Scriptures.
- Penance: Go to Confession. If you find this not your cup of tea, all the more reason to go. If you really really do not want to go to Confession, then that is a sign that you really really do need to go. Do not put it off. It is a bit like going to the dentist – highly beneficial.
- Note well: Lenten penances are not to be undertaken on Sundays, which do not count as days of Lent, being feast days. You can also undertake Lenten resolutions on certain days only, such as Fridays. Also note that Wednesday 1 March is Saint David's day, Friday 17 March is Saint Patrick's day, and Monday 20 March (transferred from the day before) is Saint Joseph's day. These days do not count as days of Lent either.

Good news! A kind and generous

parishioner has given us a cheque for £500 towards the new Saint Peter statue. Let us pray for our benefactress, who wishes to remain anonymous. This means that our fundraising for that particular project is now complete. The statue will be ready by Christmas 2023, we hope.
