

The prayers and readings for today can be found in the yellow books on page 158. The Gospel is from Saint John and tells of the meeting between Jesus and the Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well, and how he promises her living water. Liturgical notes

In the season of Lent, the Church's liturgy is deliberately sober. The vestments are purple, the colour of penitence, on the weekdays and Sundays of Lent. The Gloria is omitted. There is no Alleluia. The organ is used only to support the singing, except on Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent, when Hamish will play at the 6pm Mass. There are no flowers on the altar. Friday is the feast of Saint Patrick, patron saint of Ireland.

How is your Lent going so far? Have you got a plan? Lent means:

- Fasting
- Almsgiving
- Prayer
- Penance, that is, going to Confession.

And the point of all this is preparation for the Paschal Triduum and Easter. Easter is a feast spread over three days, namely:

- Holy Thursday, April 6, when we commemorate the Last Supper, the giving of the Eucharist, the foundation of the priesthood, and the call to serve. Mass is at 8pm, followed by silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose until midnight.
- Good Friday, April 7, the day if the suffering and death of Jesus on the Cross. Stations of the Cross at 12 noon for children and families. The Liturgy of the Passion is at 3pm, the hour at which Our Lord died.
- Holy Saturday, April 8, our day of waiting at the tomb of Our Lord, which concludes with the Easter Vigil, which begins at 8pm, at which we celebrate the resurrection and renew our baptismal promises. On Easter Sunday, April 9, Mass is at 8.30, 10am and 11.30am, and we will renew our baptismal promises at each one.
- To summarise:
- WITNESS the last Supper and WATCH with Our Lord on the eve of His Passion in the Garden of Gethsemane.
- STAND at the foot of the Cross.

• RENEW your baptismal commitment on the day of the Resurrection.

Lighting news. As you are all aware, our

lighting system in the Church is not great, and the cost of having it serviced/repaired is very high, so we are looking at installing a new lighting system. Dom Henderson is advising us, and Fr Alexander recently went to Saint Andrew's with Dom, where we met the Vicar, who received us warmly, and Robert Chesterfield, who installed the lighting at Saint Andrew's, which is very fine and with which some of you may be familiar. Robert will now be coming to Saint Peter's to advise on what can be done here. This will be a long process, but at least we are making progress towards a better lighting future. Incidentally, once the new lighting is installed, whenever that may be, only then can we consider repainting the Church interior. Furthermore, the interior of Saint Andrew's is 'limewashed' which looks very fine....

Roof News: Adrian Egan has completed his work and we now just need to see what happens when it next rains. If there are no leaks, its is mission accomplished and the scaffolding can be removed.

Many thanks for the further donation of $\pounds 11$ from the sale of plants for the Ukraine appeal. This brings our parish giving so far up to £3,856.50.


