

This Sunday is the Thirty-Second

Sunday in Ordinary Time. The prayers and readings are to be found in the yellow books on page 152. The first reading is from the Book of Wisdom, in which we are urged to seek Wisdom, which is the most desirable of God's gifts. In the Gospel, from Saint Matthew, Jesus tells the parable of the wise and the foolish virgins. The former have plenty of oil for their lamps and are not caught short when the bridegroom is delayed. The foolish, by contrast, are not so well-prepared, and as a result miss the wedding. The Lord tells us, referring to His second coming: 'So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

This Sunday there is Children's Liturgy at the 10am Mass.

This Sunday is Remembrance Sunday, on which we pay for all those who have died in war. The Vigil Mass at 6pm will be a Requiem Mass for All the Dead of War. The morning Masses will be the Mass of the Thirty-Second Sunday of the Year.

Next Sunday at 6pm, we are having our Altar Servers' training and party. Please confirm attendance by signing the list in the sacristy. Pizza will be served, we hope, and we shall be playing the Bomb Game. We start in Church and then move into the Hall.

Next Sunday at the 11.30am Mass, Alberto and Tina Amodio are celebrating 50 years of marriage. Many congratulations to them. They will have a special blessing at the end of Mass.

Liturgical notes

The month of November is dedicated to prayer for the faithful departed. On days when there is no feast, we will be celebrating the daily Mass for the Dead. Let us devote ourselves assiduously to this intention.

Wednesday is the feast of Saint Albert the Great, bishop and doctor of the Church. On **Thursday**, the annual Mass for Deceased Clergy of this deanery will take at 6pm at Saint John the Baptist in Kemptown. All are invited, indeed encouraged, to attend. Afterwards there will be refreshments in the Fitzherbert Centre next to the Church. **Friday** is the feast of Saint Hugh of Lincoln.

Confessions are heard after Mass on

Friday morning, at 10.30am. On Saturday Confessions are heard before the evening Mass, at 5.15pm until 5.45pm.

It is a commonplace to say that

everyone is welcome in a Catholic Church; while it is easy to say, it needs to be backed up by deeds if it is not just to be hollow words. In the Royal Family, children under the age of 4 are not taken to Church, but left at home with the nanny. We, however, accept and welcome children of all ages, babies, toddlers and those of school age, all children, without exception. Some parents may worry that their children seem exuberant, even boisterous, but all children are from time to time, so do not worry. None of us are dismayed or put off by little ones crying, shouting, screaming or running around. Indeed, we welcome it, as this is the upcoming new generation of Catholics and we want to see them coming to Church with their parents, and we want them to keep on coming. So do not be worried if you think your child is worse than anyone else's - they are probably not, and even if they are, so what! We were all young once. While one of our Masses is traditionally thought of as a Family Mass, ALL our Masses are family Masses, and children are welcome at all of them. While on this subject, let us all show that we are pleased to see children in Church, and remember that body language as well as words are important. Let us also remember that we encourage children to take active part in the Liturgy, in accord with their age and inclination: bringing up the collection and the gifts, joining in children's liturgy,

and as readers and servers, once they have done their First Holy Communion.
