## This Sunday is the Twenty-Fourth

Sunday of the Year, and the readings can be found in the blue Mass books on page 132. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, we hear one of the Songs of the Suffering Servant, in which the prophet speaks of the burdens of his vocation, and which foreshadows the sufferings of Jesus Himself. We reflect on reading this that Jesus freely undertook His sufferings to release us from our sins. In the Gospel, Jesus asks the disciples who do people think He is and receives a variety of answers, though Peter confesses the truth about Him; however, when Jesus reveals that the Messiah is to suffer, Peter

remonstrates with Him and is rightly rebuked. Jesus then makes it clear to all that the Cross is an essential part of discipleship: if we are to follow Him, it means that like Him we must embrace the way of suffering.

**We have heard the sad news of the death of Father Mario Sanderson** which took place on Monday 16 August at Holy Cross Care Home. The reception of the body and Vigil Mass for the deceased will take place on Monday 20 September at 4.30pm at Saint Thomas of Canterbury, Mayfield. The Funeral Mass will take place at noon in the same Church on Tuesday 21 September, to be followed by burial in Saint Dunstan's churchyard. The services will be livestreamed. If anyone is proposing to go to either service, please inform Fr Alexander.

**On Monday 13 September, after the 10am Mass we will be commending the ashes of Bernie Harvey for burial** at the end of the Mass. Let us continue to pray for the repose of her soul and for her husband David and her children at this difficult time.

**We have heard the sad news of the death of Mildred Florence Douglass**, known as Millie, who died, aged 96 years, at Worthing Hospital on 29 August. She lived for many years, until recently, in Wordsworth Rd. Her funeral service will take place on Monday 20 September at 12.30pm, followed by interment at Hove Cemetery. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and the comfort of her six children, Sandra, Pete, Marilyn, John, Linda and Carol.

**Liturgical notes**

The month of September is dedicated to the Holy Angels and on days when there is no feast we shall celebrate the Votive Mass of the Angels.  
 Monday is the feast of Saint John Chrysostom.  
 Tuesday is the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. According to tradition, first mentioned by Saint Cyril of Jerusalem in 348, Saint Helen, nearing the end of her life, decided under divine inspiration to travel to Jerusalem in 326 to excavate the Holy Sepulchre and attempt to locate the True Cross. A Jew by the name of Judas, aware of the tradition concerning the hiding of the Cross, led those excavating the Holy Sepulchre to the spot in which it was hidden. Three crosses were found on the spot. According to one tradition, the inscription Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum ;' Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews' remained attached to the True Cross. According to a more common tradition, however, the inscription was missing, and Saint Helena and Saint Macarius, the bishop of Jerusalem, assuming that one was the True Cross and the other two belonged to the thieves crucified alongside Christ, devised an experiment to determine which was the True Cross. In one version of the latter

tradition, the three crosses were taken to a woman who was near death; when she touched the True Cross, she was healed. In another, the body of a dead man was brought to the place where the three crosses were found, and laid upon each cross. The True Cross restored the dead man to life. In celebration of the discovery of the Holy Cross, Constantine ordered the construction of churches at the site of the Holy Sepulchre and on Mount Calvary. Those churches were dedicated on September 13 and 14, 335, and shortly thereafter the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross began to be celebrated on the latter date. The feast slowly spread from Jerusalem to other churches, until, by the year 720, the celebration was universal.

Wednesday is the feast of the nativity of Our Lady of Sorrows. Friday is the feast of Saint Robert Bellarmine.

**Next year, the United Kingdom** and the Commonwealth will celebrate The Queen's 70th anniversary, her Platinum Jubilee - the first time any British monarch has reached this historic milestone. There will be various celebrations across the country, culminating in a four day holiday from Thursday 2 June to Sunday 5 June inclusive. This is still some way off, but it is important that we begin to think of what we want to do to mark this national celebration which the children in our parish will undoubtedly remember for years. It would be a great shame for Saint Peter's not to take part, and to miss being a focus of festivity in the community. In addition, we are an international community and it is worth celebrating the way the United Kingdom is home to so many people of differing origin, all united in living here and enjoying it too. The Platinum Jubilee celebrations will undoubtedly reflect this at

national level, but we need to mark this at local level too. To this end, it is proposed to set up an Action Committee to look at what we can do. The committee has now been embodied in the persons of Eileen Harris, MBE, her daughter Trish, Wendy Wallis, and Milad Albadin. We look forward to having further members and will be meeting soon.

**Our Choirs are both back in business** as you will have heard at the 10am and the 11.15am Masses last week. We are still awaiting instructions about refilling the Holy Water stoups, but otherwise, apart from Children's Liturgy, everything is as it was, more or less. If you are a reader, a Eucharistic minister, on duty at Mass, please come into the sacristy for prayers before the mass begins at about seven minutes prior to the start. Meanwhile abundant thanks to Clive, our resident accordionist for his great accompaniment at the 10am and 11.15am Sunday masses when the others have been away.

**Our prayers have been asked for Eric Mee** who lives in Ireland who is unwell. He has been added to the sick list published in this newsletter. Please keep all the people on the list in your prayers, as they have all asked to be remembered by the parish.
