### Prayer for our Diocese



This Sunday is the Second Sunday of the Year. John's account of Jesus meeting Simon Peter and Andrew is rather different to Mark's story. John tells us that Andrew was first a follower of John the Baptist, and after meeting Jesus he brings Peter to him. In Mark's story (which we hear next Sunday), Jesus sees the two of them in their boat and calls them. It is entirely possible that the events of today's Gospel precede those narrated by Mark, and though the two disciples had already met Jesus, they had yet to be asked to leave fishing behind them. This might help to explain why they responded so guickly to his call by the lakeside. But 'harmonising' the gospels in this way is not really necessary. What matters more is discerning what each evangelist is saying to us through their telling of the story. John's account shows us how people are

led to Jesus. John points Jesus out to two of his disciples. They then go and encounter Jesus for themselves. We are told they spent 'the rest of the day' with him, Given that it was the 10<sup>th</sup> hour, that was about two hours. Andrew, having encountered Jesus, then tells his brother and brings him to Jesus.

Another theme of John's story is that of 'seeing deeply'. John 'stares hard' at Jesus and recognises him as the Lamb of God. Jesus 'looks hard' at Peter and sees in him the rock on which, according to Matthew, he will build the Church. In both cases they 'see' something which is beyond the visible and superficial.

To 'see' in this way, to perceive the deeper reality of things, is something we too must strive for. Bishop Richard has spent a great deal of time, consultation and prayer to 'see' the way forward for the diocese, which he has set out in the Pastoral Plan. And what we 'see' is that the way forward is to follow the Lamb of God, the Messiah, the Word who is Life. As Bishop Richard puts it: "We are called to be ever more closely conformed to Christ, that as His disciples we may bring the Good News to our brothers and sisters".

#### Bishop Richard has written a new Pastoral Plan for the Diocese, 'The Word Who is Life: The Call to Mission'.

As society becomes more secular our parishes must be ever-clearer beacons of light guiding people to Christ. The new plan highlights how our community of faith can embrace this important time of renewal, forging diocesan parishes into communities of saints and strong, lively and welcoming schools of discipleship.
