We are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are now beginning the prophet Jeremiah. Please visit our website which is constantly being updated.

This Sunday is the Sixth Sunday of Easter. The prayers and readings are to be found in the yellow books on page 268. The first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, tells us how Philip, one of the newly appointed deacons, went on a mission to proclaim the Good News to the Samaritans. In the second reading, Saint Peter is talking to the newly baptised Christians of Rome and reminding them to explain the faith to unbelievers "with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in

the accusations that they bring." He points out that Jesus, who was condemned to a criminal's death, was innocent. In the Gospel, from Saint John, Jesus tells us that if we love Him, we will keep His commandments. This implies that keeping the commandments can be done more easily if we do so out of love, rather than duty, or perhaps fear.

This Sunday, there is Children's Liturgy at the 10am Mass.

Many thanks to all those who made the Coronation Weekend events the success they were. Thanks to the servers who

were there on the eve of Coronation Mass on the Friday, which meant we were able to have incense, and thanks to Hamish for his superb playing. Thanks to all the musicians on Sunday for helping with the National Anthem and the Domine. Salvum fac. Abundant thanks to our Syrian parishioners who catered a magnificent feast in the Hall after the 11.30am Mass, which everyone said was delicious, and which was all eaten with the greatest of pleasure. We hope to have another Syrian buffet for the feast of Saint Charbel, And thanks to all who contributed to the Tea Dance, by decorating and preparing the Hall, by baking, by providing music and making it all such fun. We can safely say that our parish was fully compliant in carrying out the orders of the Bishops' Conference on how to celebrate this great national occasion. It was particularly nice to have a Syrian Coronation lunch, given that HM King is a longstanding friend of the Christians of the Middle East. In the meantime, with donations for the food on both occasions we have been able to send the sum of £340 to Aid to the Church in need, which we have asked this charity to earmark for Syria.

Liturgical notes

It is the month of May, which is traditionally devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Because of this, we shall be singing the traditional Marian hymns at the end of Mass, and on days when there is no funeral, we shall have the Rosary after the weekday Mass.

Thursday is the feast of the Ascension of the Lord. There will be an 'extra' Mass for this important

feast, a holy day of obligation, at 7pm in the evening. Please note that Mass will also be celebrated at noon at the Sacred Heart Church in Norton Road, to which all are welcome.

The period between Ascension

Thursday and Pentecost Sunday, which marks the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Church, is the time in which the apostles 'devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.' (Acts 1:14). This period of nine days of prayer in the original novena. During these nine days we should involve the Holy Spirit by praying or singing the Veni Creator/Come Holy Spirit. We will do this at each Mass between Ascension and Pentecost.

Monday 29 May is the third Bank Holiday of the month, and it is also the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. Mass will be at 10am, and by popular demand, we shall have a Power breakfast in Scottie's afterwards. All are invited. Please note this in your diary now.

Friday is the feast of Saint Dunstan, bishop.

Please note that from now on, as the Bishop has requested, we shall endeavour to have one Mass a week for the intention of Vocations.

Confessions are after Mass on Friday morning, at 10.30am. On Saturday

Confessions are heard before the evening Mass, at 5.15pm until 5.45pm.

The funeral of the late Michael Wilkinson will take place here at 11.30 on Tuesday 30th May. After the Requiem Mass, to be celebrated by his brother, Father Paul Wilkinson, burial will follow that afternoon at Woodingdean cemetery. This will replace the 10am Mass on that day.

The next Baptism course is taking place on Monday 29 May in the Hall at 8pm. If you have a baby to baptise, you will need to contact Fr Alexander and he will come and see you at home first.

Social dancing happens at 8pm in the Hall on Thursday; all are welcome. On Friday the Social club meets at 1.30pm.

The meeting of the Finance Committee will take place on Tuesday 16 May. One thing we are hoping to do very soon is reintroduce counters and bankers, which means we would like those who did this in the past, if they are able to re-volunteer, and others to volunteer afresh. If you are approached, this means counting the collection (not every week, there would be a rota) and taking the collection to the bank. Until now Vincent has been doing this all on his own. Incidentally, the counting rota was abolished on the advice of the diocese given the mistaken idea that handling money could be a way of catching Covid. This is now known not to be the case.

We are looking at the list of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Some have retired since Covid, and we are very grateful to them for all their work over the years. We will try to recruit some replacements. This is a very important ministry of the Church, and involves helping with the distribution of Holy Communion under both kinds at Mass, but also taking Holy Communion to the sick and housebound. When we have got our list together we shall have a refresher course and meet to discuss any problems and challenges we might have. One thing the parish needs is people who are willing to visit the sick at home and take them Holy Communion; this necessitates a DBS check in some circumstances. But this ministry is very important and needs to be prioritised.

All the Parish Core Groups of Hove

met last Tuesday, which included the Acutis Group. The idea of this meeting was to get to know each other and to explore the way forward with regard to the union of the three parishes of Hove, which is due to take place in the next few years. The meeting was cheerful and productive, and we will meet again in July. There is not much to report at this stage, but we are all keen to 'grow together.' With this in mind, please note the Mass on Thursday 1 June at Sacred Heart at 7pm which is an opportunity for the entire deanery to come together in prayer, and which will be followed by a social.
