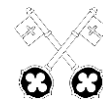

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven.

On this important feast there are a special set of readings for the Vigil Mass which are in the blue Mass books on page 178. On the Sunday morning, the first reading is from the Book of the Apocalypse and tells of a great sign appearing in the heavens which is traditionally identified with the Mother of God, namely a woman adorned with the sun, standing on the moon and crowned with stars. In the Gospel we hear the hymn of Our Lady, the Magnificat, in which she recounts the marvels the Lord has worked for her, and how all generations will call her blessed. The readings can be found in the

blue Mass books on page 180. The feast of the Assumption celebrates the fact that at the end of her earthly life, Mary was assumed, that is, taken up, into heaven, body and soul, to take her place in glory with Her Son. This is commemorated in the last two decades of the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary.

Our next Baptism Class is on Monday 6 September at 8pm either in the refurbished Hall or in the Upper Room. If you want to enrol, you need to see Father Alexander first; please email him and he will arrange to come and see you at home.

Once more we are raffling something in aid of the Hall. We have been given three model ships, representing Christopher Columbus's little fleet that sailed the ocean blue in 1482 to the New World: the Nina, the Pinta and the Santa Maria. Many thanks to the generous donor. Tickets are £1 each and will be on sale after each Mass, this week and next. The draw will be next Sunday. Have a good look at the ships on display and do not miss your chance!

Liturgical notes

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. On days on which there is no feast we shall say one of the Votive Masses of Our Blessed Lady.

Monday is the feast of Saint Stephen of Hungary

Friday is the feast of Saint Bernard. Saint Bernard is the founder of the Cistercian order, famous for his theological writings. here are some quotes from his works:

“There are those who seek knowledge for the sake of knowledge; that is Curiosity. There are those who seek knowledge to be known by others; that is Vanity. There are those who seek knowledge in order to serve; that is Love.”

“The road to hell is paved with good intentions.”

“Neither fear nor self-interest can convert the soul. They may change the appearance, perhaps even the conduct, but never the object of supreme desire... Fear is the motive which constrains the slave; greed binds the selfish man, by which he is tempted when he is drawn away by his own lust and enticed (James 1:14). But neither fear nor self-interest is undefiled, nor can they convert the soul. Only charity can convert the soul, freeing it from unworthy motives.”

“Blessed,” he says, “are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God” (Mt 5:9). Consider carefully that it is not the people who call for peace but those who make peace who are commended. For there are those who talk but do nothing (Mt 23:3). For just as it is not the hearers of the law but the doers who are righteous (Rom 2:13), so it is not those who preach peace but the authors of peace who are blessed.”

Saturday is the feast of Saint Pius X, pope.

It is now time for us to resume a few more things that have been discontinued over the pandemic. Aisling is in the office and building up the readers’ rotas and those for Eucharistic ministers (the latter are not so pressing as Holy Communion remains under one kind for now.) Please email her with your availability if you have not done so already. And please email her with same if you are invited to become a reader, which is a very important ministry in the Church. We shall also return as from this Sunday with the custom of readers and ministers gathering in the sacristy ten minutes before Mass for prayers.

Hall update: We set ourselves the target of raising £30,000 to defray the expenses of refurbishing the Hall. Many thanks to the parishioners who have kindly given us a cheque for £300, which has now brought our running total to £13,004.84. Great news! Many thanks to all who have contributed. Many thanks to Mary and Mary for running the stall after Masses on Sunday morning, the proceeds from which go to the hall refurbishment fund. When we say Mass for benefactors this Mass is for all those who have contributed time and money to the Hall project. Meanwhile, though we have had to cancel/postpone the Mayor’s visit, the problem with suppliers seems to be on the way to resolution, but, to avoid further disappointment we shall not be planning anything in the Hall until it is actually finished. Let us hope this will be reasonably soon.

The Finance Committee met on Monday 9 August and discussed, among other things, the Hall project (see above). We also noted the way the Poor Box at the back of the Church was bringing in some very kind donations, and how this was being spent. Currently we are regularly supporting one refugee family, and we have also helped out others in ‘one off’ financial difficulties. The candle boxes are also generating a steady income, covering the expenses of the candles, both votive and otherwise. We have made considerable savings of late, and our income has revived since the year 2020 ran its course, so the parish is in good financial shape. After the Hall project is over, we will give all such projects and fundraising a rest!

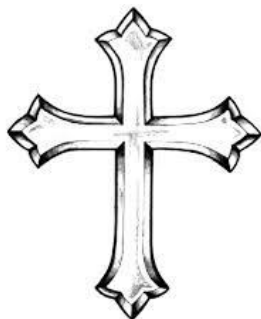

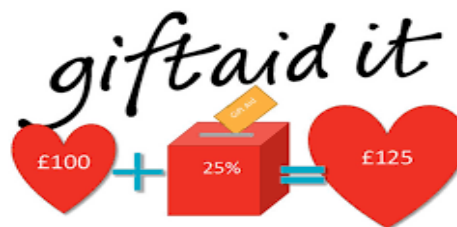
