We are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are starting the prophet Ezekiel. This Sunday is the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The prayers and readings are to be found in the yellow books on page 102. The first reading is from the prophecy of Isaiah, and consists of one important sentence, in which God tells us that His word never fails, but always produces fruit, just as the rain always causes plants to grow. In the Gospel, from Saint Matthew, we have the parable of the sower. (We will have the sort version). This seems to contradict the first reading, as we see that the seed, once sown, does not always produce a crop: some of it is eaten by birds, others shoot up but have no roots, and others get choked. So, we

need to keep two things in mind. The Word of God is always powerful, but its effectiveness will depend on our response to it.

### Liturgical notes

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Our Lord. We shall be singing some of the hymns to the Precious Blood, though which, let us remember, we are redeemed. We are in Ordinary Time, which continues until Advent. On days on which there is no feast we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of the Precious Blood. August is dedicated to the Immaculate heart of Mary, and on days when there is no feast we shall be celebrating a Votive Mass of Our Lady. Confessions are heard after Mass on Friday morning, at 10.30am. On Saturday Confessions are heard before the evening Mass, at 5.15pm until 5.45pm.

If you were here last Sunday, we had a bit of a drama with no less than two of the Hall loos being out of action. They were blocked with wet wipes, which should not be put down our loos.
