It is now clear to us that as from 1st January, there will be no resident priest in Saint Peter's, and the Church will be served by various visiting priests, among whom will be Fr Rod Jones OSB who is the dean, and his fellow monks, along with Fr Chris Benvon, Fr Carl Davies, Fr Paul Wilkinson, Fr Celestine, the hospital chaplain, and others. The ultimate referee is the Dean, Fr Rod. The new parish priest will be arriving in the summer. In the meantime, the parish secretary and the parish treasurer will on duty at their usual hours. In addition, members of the Acutis Group are there to liaise with the Dean. The Acutis Group members include: Mary Yagoub, Melitsa Bowen, Aleks Szczerbiak, Sam Barrett & Kate Szeless.

All Masses are to continue as scheduled, both on weekdays and Sundays. Emergency sick calls will be undertaken by Father Tony in Southwick.

This is not a desirable situation, but it is an opportunity rather than a crisis. Certain things like opening the Church and getting it ready for Masses will be reliant on our parishioners stepping forward to help out; and there is nothing to stop parishioners organising things if they so desire. To this end, we need co-ordinators at every Mass who can make sure everything is put out, and put away, and answer the questions of the visiting priests with regard to things like lighting, heating etc. The parish is the responsibility of all its parishioners, and has always been; from 1st January this will be more apparent than ever.

Fr Alexander's Leaving: We will host a gathering to wish him well on his next journey after 11.30am Mass on December 31st in the hall, please join us. This is the



Programme of Events

Sunday 17th December is the Third

Sunday of Advent. The prayers and readings are to be found in the aquamarine books on page 87. Today is one of two days in the Church's year when rose vestments are worn. This colour represents a softening of our Advent penances, and our happiness that Christmas is approaching. This Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday, after the opening words of the Mass: 'Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.' The first reading is from the Prophet Isaiah, in which the prophet explains the role of the coming Messiah, which is to proclaim the Lord's year of favour, that is, a special time for us to be reconciled with God. In the Gospel, from Saint John, we hear from John the Baptist, a voice crying in the wilderness, calling people to a baptism of repentance.

On Sunday 17th December, the Carol Service takes place at 6.30pm. There will be a retiring collection for Aid to the Church in Need, earmarked for Syria. If you would like to bring wine and mince pies to the Hall afterwards, that would be greatly appreciated.

On Monday 18th December, Mass is at 10am. Confessions will be heard after Mass.

On Tuesday 19th December, Mass is at 7am, and is the last of our Rorate Masses in honour of Our Lady as we prepare for Christmas. Please bring your own candle, as Mass will be by candlelight and will end at dawn. After Mass we will go to Scottie's for a Power Breakfast to which all are invited. On Wednesday 20th December Mass is at 10am.

Thursday 21st December is a *dies non*, and there will be no Mass. The Church will be shut for cleaning and flower arranging and other important matters.

On Friday 22nd December, Mass is at 10am, and is the funeral of the late Veronica Hope, who died, having received the sacrament of the Sick and the Apostolic Pardon, in the Lindridge Nursing Home at the age of 100 on Monday 20th November. Veronica will be commended for cremation at the Church door. After the funeral is over, there will be Confessions.

Saturday 23rd/Sunday 24th December is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. The prayers and readings are to be found on page 90 of the aquamarine books. The first reading is taken from the second Book of Samuel, and in it the prophet Nathan foretells the coming of the Messiah, the descendant of David whose throne will be established forever. The Gospel comes from Saint Luke and tells of the Annunciation to Our Lady by the Angel Gabriel, who tells her that she is to bear a son who will be called Jesus and whose reign will have no end. Please note the following:

- Confessions 5.15 -5.45pm Masses are at the usual times, namely:
 - 6pm
 - 8.30am
 - 10am
 - 11.30am.

Because the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Christmas Eve there will be minimal music at all Masses. Sunday 24th/Monday 25th December is

the feast of the Nativity of the Lord, known as Christmas. There will be, as usual, five Christmas Masses, along with Mass in Portuguese, as well as an Oriental Orthodox Liturgy. All will have music bar the Dawn Mass. Mass is at

- 4.30pm (in Portuguese)
- 6pm Vigil
- 12 Midnight
- 8.30am Dawn
- 10am Day
- 11.30am Day.
- 1pm: Oriental Orthodox Liturgy celebrated by Abouna Aphram

The prayers and readings can be found in the aquamarine books on page 94 for the Vigil Mass, page 98 for Midnight Mass, page 100 for the Dawn Mass, and page 102 for the Day Mass. On Christmas Day the collection is the traditional offering of the parish for the maintenance of the parish priest throughout the year.

Tuesday 26th December is the Feast of St Stephen, deacon and first martyr of the Church, and Mass is at noon. Carols will be sung. Also on Tuesday there will be an Eastern Orthodox Liturgy at 2pm. The celebrant will be the Bishop, Mar Silwan, assisted by Abouna Michel.

On Wednesday 27th **December**, feast of Saint John, apostle and evangelist, Mass will be at 10am. Carols will be sung.

Thursday 28th December will be a dies non and the Church will be shut.

On Friday 29th December, feast of Saint Thomas of Canterbury, martyr and patron saint of the English parochial clergy, Mass will be at 10am. Carols will be sung. Saturday 30th/Sunday 31st December is the Sunday after Christmas and is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The prayers and readings can be found in the aguamarine books on page 105. The first reading is an exhortation, from the Book of Ecclesiasticus, to children to fulfil God's commandment to honour their parents. The Gospel, from Saint Luke, is the story of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, where the Child Jesus is hailed as the Messiah by Simeon and Anna, who make prophesies about Him. Because this Sunday falls on New Year's Eve, the last day of the year, it is customary to recite the Te Deum, the hymn of thanksgiving for all the blessings we have received in the year 2023. We shall do this at all Masses after Holy Communion. There will be sheets provided.

Bishop Richard has written a new

Pastoral Plan for the Diocese which will be released in the New Year: 'The Word Who is Life: The Call to Mission'. As society becomes more secular our parishes must be ever-clearer beacons of light guiding people to Christ. The new Plan highlights how our community of faith can embrace this important time of renewal, forging diocesan parishes into communities of saints and strong, lively, and welcoming schools of discipleship. 
