This Sunday is the Seventh Sunday of the Year. The prayers and readings for today can be found in the yellow books on page 139. The first reading is from the book of Leviticus, and contains God's call to us to be holy and to love our neighbour, both of which are interdependent realities. The Gospel is from Saint Matthew, and contains Jesus' teaching about loving our neighbour, and doing so without hope of reward, imitating God who loves both good and bad alike.

Children's Liturgy takes place at the 10am Mass. It is for children from year minus 1 to First Holy Communion age. Children and parents who wish to take part will be called up after the Gloria and Opening Prayer, and will then process into the Hall. They will return for the Offertory. Children's Liturgy is every Sunday, irrespective of school holidays, except in the months of April, August and December.

The Lent Day by Day books have arrived. Please take your free copy. There are three versions, as usual, which take you through the season of Lent: adult, junior and infant.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Make sure you get those Ashes, so that you can have the best possible start to Lent. On Ash Wednesday Mass will be at 10am, and the Ashes will be imposed at that Mass. There will also be a Liturgy of the Word (not Mass) with the Imposition of Ashes at 7pm. In addition, there are going to be two Assemblies at Cottesmore, to enable every child in the school to have the Ashes. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence for adults. This means that people of the ages 19 to 64 should refrain from eating meat and, at some point of the day, feel hungry. This does not apply to those who are dispensed from this, such as the sick.

This Friday, and every Friday of Lent, there will be Stations of the Cross at 7pm. This Friday we will be using the traditional stations written by Saint Alphonsus Liguori, as found in the Simple Prayer Book.

Next Sunday which is the First Sunday of Lent, the Martlets Choir will be serenading us in the Hall after the 10am and 11.30am

Masses. Once more a hat will be put out to raise money for the Hospice, a very worthy local charity.

Liturgical notes

Allahuiran Zadeh RIP

- On Monday, Mass will be the Mass for the Sick.
- Tuesday is the feast of Saint Peter Damian, bishop and doctor.
- Wednesday is Ash Wednesday.

Lent means

- Fasting: think of what food or drink you can give up. This is usually some sort of luxury (chocolate, cake, alcohol, etc). In addition, you can also renounce something that you spent too much time on, and choose to restrict television, the internet, screen time, or sleep.
- Almsgiving: you could donate to the foodbank, help some financially challenged people you know directly, or give to the collection for Lenten alms that we will hold on Sunday 5 March which will be for the earthquake victim in Syria and Turkey. You can combine fasting with almsgiving by undertaking the Cafod Family Fast day on 3 March.
- Prayer: the best prayer is attendance at Mass on Sundays and during the week. In addition, we will have the Stations of the Cross on Fridays. One can pray at home or privately, by saying the Rosary, and meditating on the Scriptures.
- Penance: Go to Confession. If you find this not your cup of tea, all the more reason to go. If you really really do not want to go to Confession, then that is a sign that you really really do need to go. Do not put it off. It is a bit like going to the dentist – highly beneficial.

We have heard the sad news of the death of John Torres, at the age of 91, which took place at Sycamore Court Nursing Home, in Brighton on 3 February. He had previously lived at Sunninghill Avenue, Hove. His funeral Mass will take place here at 11am on Friday 24 February, to be followed by a private cremation. This will replace the 10am Mass on that day. Let us pray for his children and grandchildren, family and friends at this sad and difficult time, and for the repose of John's soul.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Dennis John Geary who died at the Princess Royal Hospital on Saturday 11 February, at the age of 97, having received the Sacrament of the Sick and the Apostolic Pardon. His burial will take place at Hove Cemetery at 9am on Tuesday 28 February. Let us pray for the repose of his soul and for the comfort of his widow and six children at this sad and difficult time for them.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Barbara Rozario who died at the age of 87 in the Royal Sussex County Hospital on Wednesday 15 February. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and for her family at this sad and difficult time. Her funeral arrangements will be announced in due course.
