

Thoughts about Stewardship II

Last week we talked of the challenges involved with the maintenance of the building, which cannot be avoided. One also has to think about the development of the parish buildings, in other words, projects that add some value to the parish and its mission. Of late we have added a stained glass window, which has attracted much positive comment, and we have refurbished the Hall. Both of these are to be understood as missionary projects, that is to say, designed to bring people closer to God and His Church, directly or indirectly. We have also done a few minor things, like bought a new candle stand, and put up several pictures; we have also set up the shrine to the Blessed Carlo; but there are certainly other things to be done to make the Church more accessible, more transparent in its mission as a Church and a Catholic church as well. We do not have any bells, though we have a fine bell tower, and one can install electronic bells at a reasonable cost. Bells are, believe it or not, a very old, but very effective, marketing tool. We do have leaflets of various types and a shop, likewise tried and tested marketing tools. Our notice boards, outside and in, perhaps need attention. It is good that the Church is open every day bar Thursdays, and that many people come in (one knows this because of the number of candles lit); this provision of a sacred space in which people can reflect and pray is very important. We are very lucky to have two members of our parish, Mark and Lee, who put in many hours looking after the Church when it is open. We do have problems with abusive people coming in and creating a disturbance, and sometimes frightening people at prayer, or doing things they ought not to in Church (or indeed anywhere else). This is something we do have to be aware of. We must not tolerate or encourage abusive behaviour of any sort. One final point: the Church is made available to the Eastern Orthodox and the

Oriental Orthodox on a frequent basis, which they appreciate very much. Contact with other communities is very important. In conclusion, given that we have a fine set of buildings, we should, as part of our stewardship, evaluate and develop their functions as places of encounter with the Lord. This will involve an appreciation of the way 'soft' marketing works. With every footfall in the Church, the Kingdom of God spreads.



This Sunday is the feast of Corpus

Christi, the day on which we celebrate the mystery of the Body and Blood of Christ. The prayers and readings can be found in the maroon books on page 83. The first reading is taken from the Book of Genesis, and tells the story of Melchizedek, who comes to meet Abraham with offerings of bread and wine, who then gives him a tithe (i.e. ten percent) of everything. The second reading comes from Saint Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, and is the

oldest account we have of the institution of the Eucharist. After the second reading we will recite the sequence together, just the last three asterisked verses. The Gospel, taken from Saint John, recounts the feeding of the five thousand.

Liturgical notes

After Pentecost, the Church enters the season of Ordinary Time, when the vestments are green. This Sunday is Corpus Christi. Next Sunday will be the Thirteenth Sunday of the year. The month of June is the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart, and on days when there is no feast we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart, the solemnity of which falls this Friday. After the 10am Mass, you are all invited to a Power Breakfast at Scottie's. On the same day there is an additional Mass at noon, which is the funeral of Anne Key.

Monday is the feast of Saint Alban, the first martyr of this land.

Tuesday is the feast of Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, religious, patron saint of Catholic youth and those suffering from plague.

Wednesday is the feast of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, martyrs.

Friday is the solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Saturday is the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Let us continue to remember the three deceased members of our parish whose funerals take place this week, and keep their families in our prayers. Please note that in accord with pious custom, Sheila Coldicott's coffin will be received into the Church at 6pm on Sunday evening. There will be a brief vigil service, the Rosary, and then silent reflection for as long as those who wish to stay. Those who cannot make the funeral next day can take part in our farewell to Sheila and our prayers for her soul by attending the reception and vigil.

Our next baptism course is on Monday 12 September at 8pm in the Hall. If you have a baby to baptise, please see Fr Alexander who will come and see you at home, before inviting you on the course.

The Social Club meets on 24 June at 1.30pm, for tea, coffee, games and chat.

We recently had a meeting with the architects and the builders to sign off the Hall. It was interesting, to say the least, to understand the amount of damage done to the Hall since it was reopened. There are clear instructions in notices about what to do and what not to do, which some people have ignored. One hates to put up these bossy notices everywhere, but it has to be pointed out that sticking things to the walls with masking tape damages the paintwork, and so on. It is distressing to note that the lock on one of the doors has been broken, and the hinges in the kitchen cupboards have been damaged, and the windows too. One

of the floorboards has been broken thanks to someone dropping something very heavy on it. This is in addition to the usual wear and tear that one would expect. Please note the following, and spread the word.

- The dishwasher is very easy to use and has a clear set of instructions on the inside door under the sink. If you are uncertain how to use it, please ask someone who does.
- The water boiler should be used for large scale teas and coffees. It works well, is easy to use, and does not leak. Please ask if you do not know how to use it.
- If you do not know how to shut or open the windows without damaging them, please leave them well alone. The Hall has no curtains, please do not attempt to cover up the windows.
- Please do not overload the electrical system, as this damages equipment. Do not use more than one kettle at a time. We have just had to replace the speakers and the amplifier.

First Holy Communion: Next year there will be three courses, one each term. The first course is going to be on Saturdays from 10th September to 26th November inclusive (but not the two Saturdays that fall within the half term holiday). Each session will be from 9.15am to 10.45am. First Holy Communion will be celebrated on Advent Sunday, which falls on Sunday 27 November, at the 11.15am Mass. Numbers are limited. If you wish for a place for your child (and this course is for children accompanied by at least one parent), then please get in contact with Fr Alexander by email as soon as possible. In January another course will begin; and a

further course will take place in the summer term.

If you are a reader, a Eucharistic minister, on duty at Mass, please come into the sacristy for prayers before the Mass begins at about seven minutes prior to the start.
