

Confirmation: Easter Sunday falls on 9 April next year. Many thanks to all those who have registered their interest. Fr Alexander will be sending out an email to you all. In 2023, all confirmations are taking place in Arundel Cathedral. We have been assigned the date of Sunday July 2, at 3pm.

Your time to time reminder on Mass intentions. The Mass is a sacrifice. offered on Calvary, by Jesus Christ, for the salvation of all. Thus, every Mass is offered for all the living and all the dead, as is made explicit in the Eucharistic prayer. As a part of this, the priest can offer the Mass for a named individual, living or dead, at the request of the faithful, and for doing this, it is customary to offer the priest a stipend, which in this diocese is suggested to be in the region of £10. This is in keeping with tradition whereby the person who requests the Mass intention undertakes to provide for the upkeep of the priest for that day. The stipend is supposed to be the equivalent of a square meal. Priests in this diocese do not draw a salary but live off the stipends they receive, chief of which are the Christmas and Easter offerings. The list of intentions is published in the newsletter to encourage prayer for that intention and to remind people that the Mass is an efficacious sacrifice; RIP signifies 'requiescat in pace', rest in peace, in other words that the person has died. GE signifies 'good estate', in other words we are praving for the welfare of someone who is alive. Sometimes the intention is just marked 'a private intention'. If someone has died, and you request a Mass for them, you can send their family and friends a Mass card, which is signed by the priest as a sign that you have requested a Mass for the repose of the deceased's soul. These are available in our shop. Incidentally, every week, as laid down by canon law, one Mass is said for 'all our parishioners'.

This Friday, and every Friday of Lent,

there will be Stations of the Cross at 7pm. This Friday we will be doing all the Station, from one through to fourteen. It will last, as usual, about 25 minutes.

In Lent, Confessions are heard after Mass each weekday, that is, starting at 10.30am, and every Saturday before the evening Mass, from 5.15 to 5.45pm.

We have heard the sad news of the death

of Veronica Lloyd of Norway Street, who died last Sunday. She was for many years a parishioner here and at St Theresa's. Veronica's husband died last December. Her funeral will take place at St Therese's details to be announced. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and for the comfort of her family and friends.

Liturgical notes

Monday is the feast of Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mass is at 10am as usual, and because this day is not a day of Lenten penance, we shall be having a Power Breakfast at Scottie's afterwards.

Saturday is the feast of the Annunciation of the Lord, which means that there are only nine months to go until Christmas.

Lent means:

- Fasting
- Almsgiving
- Prayer
- Penance, that is, going to Confession.

Easter is a feast spread over three days, namely:

 Holy Thursday, April 6, when we commemorate the Last Supper, the giving of the Eucharist, the foundation of the priesthood, and the call to serve. Mass is at 8pm, followed by silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose until midnight. WITNESS the last Supper and WATCH with Our Lord on the eve of His Passion in the Garden of Gethsemane.

- Good Friday, April 7, the day if the suffering and death of Jesus on the Cross. Stations of the Cross at 12 noon for children and families. The Liturgy of the Passion is at 3pm, the hour at which Our Lord died. STAND at the foot of the Cross.
- Holy Saturday, April 8, our day of waiting at the tomb of Our Lord, which concludes with the Easter Vigil, which begins at 8pm, at which we celebrate the Resurrection and renew our baptismal promises. On Easter Sunday, April 9, Mass is at 8.30, 10am and 11.30am, and we will renew our baptismal promises at each one. RENEW your baptismal commitment on the day of the Resurrection.

WITNESS, WATCH, STAND, RENEW. Are

you able to invite someone to one or other or more of the Easter ceremonies? The Watching at the Altar of Repose, where you can breeze in for 15 minutes or so of peace and guiet in the silence of the night, or the family Stations of the Cross (which lasts 25 minutes or so) might be just the thing that someone who does not normally go to Church might like. Again, the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the Good Friday Passion Liturgy might also be just the thing for someone who feels the day is important, but does not really know why they think this. There may be people who would love to be invited to Church, and are just waiting for the invitation....

As we get ready for Easter, Sarah Hall will be decorating our Paschal Candle once more, as she did last year. In addition, people have already mentioned the palms for Palm Sunday. If you have a palm tree, please harvest some palms for our use on Sunday 2 April. Other green branches are also welcome. This will be much appreciated. You can drop your greenery off in the Narthex on the day before Palm Sunday.

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that we may return to our normal practice of administering the Chalice to the lay faithful from Holy Thursday. We shall be doing this, following taking soundings in the parish. Holy Communion is under two kinds

and one receives the Sacrament in its fullness when one receives the Sacred Host alone; but to make the sign more complete the faithful can receive the Precious Blood as well. The Precious Blood is always to be received with great care and reverence, as indeed is the Sacred Host. More on this in weeks to come.

The sale of mugs etc in the Hall has

generated £30 for the Syrian earthquake appeal. In addition, we have been given £10 for the Ukraine DEC appeal. This brings our parish giving for the latter so far up to £3,866.50

Bishop Richard met with the priests of the deanery on Friday 10 March. The

subject of the meeting was the pastoral plan, which essentially means the reorganisation of parishes and Mass times throughout the deanery. On Tuesday 14 March the deanery priests met at their usual meeting to consider what Bishop Richard had said, and that evening the Acutis Group met to consider this further. The Bishop foresees that the whole of Hove and Southwick will form a single parish with a central administrative hub by the year 2025.

and we should all prepare ourselves for this by working closely with other parishes. One thing this will involve is a change to Mass times, and getting used to thinking of ourselves as a joint mission area rather than single parishes. Moreover, we need to think about how we can invite people to Church. rather than just maintaining our present structures, which, from a practical point of view, are hard to maintain, and the maintenance of which may not be the best way of promoting the Church's mission in the first place. On Friday 21 April, after Easter, Bishop Richard will hold a meeting with the parish priests and with their leadership teams, which is our case means the Acutis Group, and with the various heads of local Catholic schools, for further discussion of the pastoral plan.

Did you know that in the last year we

have run through more or less 30,000 votive candles? This means they have been used up at the rate of about 80 a day. That would indicate considerable footfall in the Church on weekdays. It is very encouraging that so many people come into our Church to savour the atmosphere, to pray and to light a candle.

Electric news: Mark our electrician has been hard at work renewing the lighting in the Narthex, the Link, the yard and the presbytery kitchen. We hope you notice the difference and like it!
