Fr Alexander writes: Some months ago I asked Bishop Richard if I could have a half sabbatical, that is, a period of six months. for travel, prayer and study, and he graciously said this was possible. As a result, on 1st January, I shall be flying off to visit members of my family in Trinidad. then in Italy, and will also be visiting the Holy Land for Easter, all being well. I will return home to the diocese on July 1st. More recently Bishop Richard decided, and this of course is a decision I am happy to accept, that for the good of Saint Peter's, a new parish priest should take over on 1st January, and then when I get back I should take up a new post as parish priest elsewhere. This is a good decision, as it means that Saint Peter's will not be left without a parish priest for six months. and it also enables the Bishop to put in someone (who at present is to be decided, but will be decided soon) who will help with the unification of all the Hove parishes, which, as we all know, has been on the cards for some time and which needs to happen soon. I will of course be sad to be leaving Saint Peter's after five and a guarter years, but that is the normal length of time that parish priests should serve in one place, according to usual practice.

The Annual Interfaith Service in our City has, over the years become an important fixture. With contributions from people of many faiths within our City, we have a chance to hear some beautiful words and share some special songs and music. The Mayor, Lord Lieutenant and our popular Members of Parliament will be there. This year we celebrate the very special spirit of our City. The event is also made memorable with a legendary tea, offering a variety of special cakes and ethnic dishes, and provides an opportunity

for our friends and members to get together.

Liturgical notes

The month of November is dedicated to prayer for the faithful departed. On days when there is no feast, we will be celebrating the daily Mass for the Dead. Let us devote ourselves assiduously to this intention.

Tuesday is the feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Temple. Wednesday is the feast of Saint Cecilia, martyr, patron saint of music. Friday is the feast of Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions, martyrs of Vietnam.

Confessions are heard after Mass on Friday morning, at 10.30am. On Saturday Confessions are heard before the evening Mass, at 5.15pm until 5.45pm.

Repeated from last week: It is a commonplace to say that everyone is welcome in a Catholic Church; while it is easy to say, it needs to be backed up by deeds if it is not just to be hollow words. In the Royal Family, children under the age of 4 are not taken to Church, but left at home with the nanny. We, however, accept and welcome children of all ages, babies, toddlers and those of school age, all children, without exception. Some parents may worry that their children seem exuberant, even boisterous, but all children are from time to time, so do not worry. None of us are dismayed or put off by little ones crying, shouting, screaming or running around. Indeed, we welcome it, as

this is the upcoming new generation of Catholics and we want to see them coming to Church with their parents, and we want them to keep on coming. So do not be worried if you think your child is worse than anyone else's - they are probably not, and even if they are, so what! We were all young once. While one of our Masses is traditionally thought of as a Family Mass. ALL our Masses are family Masses, and children are welcome at all of them. While on this subject, let us all show that we are pleased to see children in Church, and remember that body language as well as words are important. Let us also remember that we encourage children to take active part in the Liturgy, in accord with their age and inclination: bringing up the collection and the gifts, joining in children's liturgy, and as readers and servers, once they have done their First Holy Communion.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Oonagh Jones, which took place on Sunday 5th November, in the Royal Sussex County Hospital. She was 86 years old. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and for her family at this sad and difficult time for them. Her funeral will take place here at 11am on Tuesday 28th November. This will replace the 10am Mass on that day.

The funeral of Brida Leslie RIP is taking place here at 11am on Friday December 1st, to be followed by burial at Hove cemetery. This will replace the 10am Mas son that day.

The funeral of Doris Mitchell RIP will take place here on Friday 8th December. The coffin will arrive in Church at 9.45am. Because that day is a solemn feast, Mass at 10am will be the Mass of the Immaculate Conception, and Doris's funeral will take place immediately

afterwards at 10.45am, to be followed by burial at Portslade Cemetery.

Brace yourselves! Advent is coming and starts on Sunday 3rd December. We have organised the following events for the Season.

- There will be three Rorate Masses by candlelight on Tuesdays in Advent at 7am. They begin in total darkness and end as dawn breaks. Afterwards we shall have a power breakfast at Scottie's.
- On Sunday10th December, the Sunday following his feast, Saint Nicholas will be making an appearance in our parish and giving out sweet and chocolates to children after the 10am and 11.30am Masses.
- The Carol Service will take place at 6.30pm on Sunday 17th December.
- This Advent, as last year, we will have one hundred £10 Sainsbury vouchers to give away as Christmas presents from the community of Saint Peter's. You may remember how this worked last year; ask your parish priest for a voucher and give it to anyone you think needs cheering up. This is financed by our Poor Fund.
- Advent is also a time for going to Confession, as we prepare for Christmas. We shall have an extra session of Confessions on Saturday 16th December from 3pm until 5.45pm, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Fr Colin and Fr Tony will be in attendance.
- Our Advent Day by Day books have arrived, for Infants, Juniors and Adults. Please help yourself from the back of the Church.


