This Sunday is the Twenty-Fifth Sunday

of the Year, and the readings can be found in the blue Mass books on page 135. The first reading is from the Book of Wisdom, and in it the wicked plot the destruction of the virtuous man, moved by envy, something which foreshadows the way the enemies of Jesus plotted to destroy Him. The second reading comes from Saint James, who rebukes the Christian community for their feuding and infighting. He contrasts this with the purity of heavenly Wisdom which builds up peace. In the Gospel, Jesus corrects the disciples for their arguing over who should be the greatest by putting before them a little

child, who acts as an exemplar of Christian humility and simplicity.

This Sunday and for the next three Sundays the congregation will be counted

as it leaves the church, by a volunteer with a 'clicker'. It is absolutely vital that we submit an accurate figure to the diocese of our Sunday congregation and the congregation at each Mass. Your co-operation is most appreciated.

Liturgical notes

The month of September is dedicated to the Holy Angels and on days when there is no feast we shall celebrate the Votive Mass of the Angels.

Monday is the feast of Saint Andrew Kim Taegon and companions, martyrs of Korea. Andrew Kim Taegon (21 August 1821 – 16 September 1846) was the first Korean-born Catholic priest and is the patron saint of Korean clergy. Kim was canonized with 102 other martyrs on 6 May 1984 by Pope Saint John Paul II. In the

late 18th century, Catholicism began to take root slowly in Korea, introduced by scholars who visited China and brought back Western books translated into Chinese. In 1836 Korea saw its first consecrated missionaries (members of the Paris Foreign Missions Society) arrive, only to find out that there were already practicing Korean Catholics. Saint Andrew Kim's parents were converts and his father was subsequently martyred for practising Christianity, a prohibited activity in heavily Confucian Korea. After being baptized at age 15, Kim studied at a seminary in the Portuguese colony of Macau. He also spent time in study in the Philippines, where today he is also venerated. In 1844, he was ordained a priest in Shanghai by the French bishop Jean- Joseph-Jean-Baptiste Ferréol. He then returned to Korea to preach and evangelize. During the Joseon Dynasty, Christianity was suppressed and many Christians were persecuted and executed. Catholics had to practise their faith covertly. Kim was one of several thousand Christians who were executed during this time. In 1846, at the age of 25, he was tortured and beheaded near Seoul on the Han River. His last words were: 'This is my last hour of life, listen to me attentively: if I have held communication with foreigners, it has been for my religion and my God. It is for Him that I die. My immortal life is on the point of beginning. Become Christians if you wish to be happy after death, because God has eternal chastisements in store for those who have refused to know Him.' Before Ferréol, the first bishop of Korea, died from exhaustion on 3 February 1853, he wanted to be buried beside Kim, stating, 'You will never know how sad I was to lose this young native priest. I have loved him as a father loved his son; it is a consolation for me to think of his eternal happiness.' At

present the Catholics of South Korea number over 5 million; the numbers in North Korea, where the Church is not able to function openly, are unknown.

Tuesday is the feast of Saint Matthew.

Friday is the feast of Our Lady of Walsingham.

Extract from Bishop Richard's Pastoral Letter regarding the Assisted Dying Bill,

'Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, There has been much coverage of the Assisted Suicide Bill, currently making its way through the House of Lords. It is important that we take action to challenge this proposed legislation. It is also vital that we affirm our support for the best possible end-of-life care, including spiritual and pastoral support for those who are dying and for their families. This has been made all the more urgent as a result of the decision by the British Medical Association to take a neutral position on this issue, albeit by the narrowest of margins.

The Catholic Church remains opposed to any form of assisted suicide. It is a crime against human life and we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it.

It is the case that, in this country as in many others, we have a growing elderly population. The needs of the elderly and the needs of those who live with disability have been highlighted further during the course of the Covid-19 pandemic. The Bill currently being considered raises serious questions about society's ability to protect those who are most vulnerable. We must ask how the law can ensure that a person

will be free from pressure to end their life prematurely due to perceptions about 'quality' or 'worth' of life, and will not feel the need to act out of a sense of 'being a burden' to family and to the wider society. In this context, it is important for us all to reach out to those who may feel isolated or lonely, enabling them to recognise their value and the contribution their experience and wisdom brings to others....'
