This Sunday is the Fifth Sunday of Easter. Liturgical notes

Monday is the feast of Saints Philip and James, apostles. Monday 3 May is also the thirtieth anniversary of the birth of the Blessed Carlo Acutis, which took place in London at the Portland Clinic, As the Blessed Carlo was particularly devoted to the Eucharist and went to Mass every day, as well as making a Holy Hour, what better way to mark the occasion by going to Mass on this day, and having a Holy Hour. Our Holy Hour will be from 7pm to 8pm and all are welcome. Once a miracle is worked through the intercession of the Blessed Carlo, he will then be on the path to sainthood. Let us pray that the miracle he 'needs' may be worked here in this parish.

Tuesday is the Feast of the English Martyrs.

The month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin. Usually this month we try to sing hymns to Our Lady, but with Covid restrictions still in place this will not be possible. There will be the Rosary after Mass on Tuesday as customary and every other day on which there is no funeral. Those who do not like communal recitation of the Rosary are warmly invited to pray the Rosary at home. Please note that Thursday 13 May, forty days after Easter, is Ascension Thursday and this is a Holy Day to be treated as a Sunday, so we will have Mass at 10am on this day. Sunday 23 May, fifty days after Easter, is Pentecost, which closes the Easter season. The period in between the two feasts is the original nine days of prayer ('novena') of the Church imploring the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Advance notice: Fr Alexander will be working remotely Monday 10 May to Wednesday 12 May inclusive, so on these days there will be no Mass. But there will be an 'extra' Mass for Ascension Thursday, and the following Thursday, 20 May, which forms part of the novena to the Holy Spirit.

Fundraiser number one: A parishioner has kindly given us an ornate Quaregnon fruit bowl. These retail for a sum of around £30, and are collectors' items. We are going to hold a silent auction for the vase in aid of the Hall restoration fund. Place the sum you want to bid with your name in an envelope marked Vase; whoever bids the most gets the vase. Bids can be put in with the collection or handed in to the sacristy. The fruit bowl is currently in the office or out on the font lid if you want to inspect it.

Fundraiser Number Two: Do you like Fish and Chips? Of course you do! Are you familiar with the Hainault Fryers Fish and Chips of 6, Boundary Road Portslade? Well, you should be. Mary and Mary our parishioners and proprietors will give you a free fish and chips if you buy a ticket from the sacristy. The money goes to the Hall refurbishment. The donation is £5, and the fish and chips are being given free by Mary and Mary. There is only a limited number of tickets available, so please get yours as soon as possible!

Of our target of £30,000 for the Hall restoration fund, we have raised £5,781.12 so far. Many thanks to all who have contributed one way or another. The Mass that we say regularly for benefactors is for those who have helped out in cash or in kind for the appeal. We are now activating our plans for the refurbishment and aftermath, and have asked the mayor to be present for the grand re-opening on Saturday 7 August at 7pm, after the evening Mass. His Worship has accepted our invitation. We also plan to have that day as an 'open day' so friends and neighbours and passers-by can see the 'new' Hall. This will be advertised, but please spread the word to your friends and neighbours, stressing that then Hall is a community space and for everyone whatever their religious allegiance of lack of it. In addition, this year we plan to have the International Dinner in the Hall with music afterwards on Saturday 14 August. On the 21 August we will have our first Film Night. The Social club will resume on the first Friday of August, all being well.

In other Hall news: when refurbishment starts, the builders will be using the

Presbytery driveway and having access to the Hall via the garage. This will save us a lot of money as we will not have to pay for parking places on the street. It will, however, mean that the driveway will be occupied and not free for parking.

We are collecting donations for the Food Bank. Please leave your donation in the tub inside the door of the Outer Sacristy. If locked, by the door.

If you want to go to the loo during Mass, then do please enter the Hall via the glass door in the Church porch, which should be open during Sunday Masses. (If it is not, please ask one of the stewards.) We are aware that this can be important for parents of young children. Unfortunately, from 10 May, the Hall will be closed for refurbishment for 12 weeks. The only loo available then will be for emergencies and that is in the ground floor of the presbytery approachable via the outer sacristy.

and other forms to sign. Aisling has kindly taken this on. Please note that forms should be dropped off in office hours only, and all the details need to be filled in before submission for signature or counter-signature and stamping. They will then be handed back to you also during office hours,

within a reasonable time. It is not possible to offer a while you wait service. Neither is it possible to countersign identity papers for people who one does not know. With regard to baptism and confirmation certificates, requests are best submitted in writing, with a stamped addressed envelope. Please remember to include as much information as possible, as this makes tracking down the records easier. Dealing with forms does take time, and the parish does not charge for this service, but craves your patience.

Those Covid Rules:

The capacity of the church is 100 people: two people per bench, spaced at one metre apart, and one person per chair. (Families can sit together.) Please spread out as widely as possible and do not bunch together.

- Please check in for track and trace purposes, either electronically or in writing.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and exit.
- Please observe the one way system: up the middle, down the sides, especially at Holy Communion.

- 1 There is STILL no congregational singing.
- The Church doors are to remain open to ventilate the building.
- Mass is shorter than usual.
- ☐ There is no procession of the Gifts to the altar and no passing around of the collection baskets. Your offering will be taken as you leave the Church.
- There is no sign of peace.
- Holy Communion will be received under one kind only.

- © Communion must be given silently, avoiding any physical contact.
- Please remove your mask (if wearing one) and gloves to receive Holy Communion.
- As you leave do not to linger in doorways or other 'choke points'.
- Once Mass is over the Church will be closed and cleaned.
- People are urged not to come to the sacristy before and after Mass, unless they are servers or sacristans.
- □ Face coverings are mandatory for all who are not exempt.
- The Bishops also urge readers to wear disposable gloves.
