We are preparing ourselves for the Synod with a series of meetings in Advent, which will take place in the Upper Room at 7.30 pm on 30 November, 7 December, 14 December and 21 December. These meetings will be chaired by Kate Williamson and will use material prepared by the diocese. There will be additional meetings in the Hall on Wednesdays 1 December, 8 December, 15 December and 22 December after Mass, at 10.30am, for those who prefer a daytime appointment. From an interview with Cardinal Grech on the upcoming Synod. **Some have already criticized the upcoming synod as too ambitious and unwieldy — how will the Synod Secretariat manage all the input from dioceses around the world and how will that information be processed and analysed?** The Synod is ambitious, and the General Secretariat of the Synod of Bishops is called to put forth a great effort out of love for the Church. Our method, however, is quite simple. The listening to the people of God within the local Churches will be concluded with a diocesan document that will be delivered to the episcopal conference. Here the bishops, exercising their charism of discernment, will produce a summary that will, in its turn, be transmitted to our Secretariat. All the material arriving from the episcopal conferences will serve as the basis for the first instrumentum laboris. This first instrumentum laboris will be the working document for the pre-synodal meetings in the various Continents (second phase). The conclusions of these meetings will then be collected as serve as the basis for the second instrumentum laboris, offered to synod fathers in 2023.

Right now we are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are currently on the First Book of Samuel. This Sunday is the Feast of Christ the King and the final Sunday of the Year. The prayers and readings can be found in the blue Mass books on page 160. The first reading comes from the prophecy of Daniel, and is the vision of one like a Son of Man, on whom is conferred all power and kingship. We see this passage, which Jesus recalls at his trial before the High Priest on Good Friday, as a prophecy of the Kingship of Christ. In the Gospel, from Saint John, Jesus testifies before Pilate (also on Good Friday) that he is indeed a King, though His Kingdom is not of this

world. His Kingship is one of love, not power.

Children's Liturgy begins again this Sunday 21 November at the 10am Mass. Participants will be called out at the appropriate moment. Thanks to those who have volunteered to help. Would anyone else like to do so?

Next Sunday marks the beginning of Advent, which is a penitential season, hence the vestments will be purple, there will be no flowers on the altar, and there will be no Gloria. (The Creed will be sung at the 11.15am Mass.) At the end of each Mass Kate Williamson will give a brief presentation about the forthcoming Synod. We have a selection of materials for Advent, and they are at the back of the Church, so please help yourself. For adults we have 'My day by Day' and 'Walk with Me', which provide the Scripture readings and a reflection for each day of the season. We also have 'My Day by Day' in Junior and Infant editions, which provide youngsters with daily activities. And finally, we have Advent Calendars for the young which do the same. Make sure you get yours!

On the First Sunday of Advent, Jayden and Kiran Mistry will be enrolled in the Guild of Saint Stephen and receive their medals.

This Advent, as we have two priests in the parish, it seems right to celebrate a Rorate Mass once a week in Advent. The name comes from the opening words of the Entrance Antiphon of the Votive Mass of Our Lady in Advent, 'Rorate cæli desuper', Latin for "Drop down dew, ye heavens". Because the Rorate Mass is a

Votive Mass in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrated in Advent, the vestments will be white. It is traditionally celebrated by candlelight. The sky is dawning just as it finishes. This is to symbolize the coming of Christ, the Light of the World. To this end you are all invited to come to Mass on Wednesdays in Advent at 7am, and bring candles in jam jars for light. We will sing some suitable hymns, and after Mass we can, if desired, go out to breakfast.

Many people no longer carry money – hence our machine for electronic donations at the back – but if you do, Josie will be collecting loose change and notes after all Sunday Masses in November in aid of the Hall. She will have her bucket, so please do be generous!

Once more this Sunday at 4pm we are holding a Holy Hour, ending in good time before the Lusophone Mass which is at 5pm. This hour has the advantage of being at the evocative time of sunset. The idea of the Holy Hour (much loved by the Blessed Carlo Acutis, who made one as often as he could) is to spend time with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, usually having silent prayer, hymns, the Evening Prayer of the Church (Vespers) and Benediction. This is a very good way of praying for the dead, and also remembering the bereaved and showing our solidarity with them.

As announced in last week's newsletter, we have a visitor in the parish, Father Stipica Lesic, who is a priest of the Archdiocese of Sarajevo in Bosnia-Herzegovina. We are very pleased to welcome him, and as he is here to perfect his English before going to the missions in

Uganda, please do your best to help him practice his English.
