Paschal Triduum and Easter Services. Easter is a feast spread over three days. namely:

- Holy Thursday, March 28, when we commemorate the Last Supper and the giving of the Eucharist. Mass is at 8pm, followed by silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose until 10pm.
- Good Friday, March 29, the day of the suffering and death of Jesus on the Cross. The Liturgy of the Passion is at 3pm, the hour at which Our Lord died.
- Holy Saturday, March 30, our day of waiting at the tomb of Our Lord. The Easter Vigil begins at 7pm, at which we celebrate the resurrection and renew our baptismal promises.
- Easter Sunday, March 31, Mass is at 8.30am, 10am and 11.30am, (Sung Mass)

We will renew our baptismal promises at each Mass.

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord Fr Tony Writes

Holy Week and Easter are the high point of the Christian calendar. And while Christmas may be more prominent as a celebration in social terms, the reason we celebrate the birth of this particular child is because of what happened at that Passover nearly 2000 years ago. And at the heart of our celebration of those events is the Triduum; three services which are in a sense, three parts of one greater whole. So on Holy Thursday we begin at the Last Supper in the Upper Room, and we end up in Gethsemane. On Good Friday we follow Jesus from his arrest to his burial.

Throughout Holy Saturday we wait, both in mourning and in hope. Then on Saturday night we celebrate his rising in light at the Easter Vigil. We look back over the history of God's relationship to his people in the light of the Resurrection, and we recall with joy our own Baptism, that made us part of

this great drama. In many places, too, people will be baptised, received into the Church, confirmed, and partake in Holy Communion for the first time on this night. Do try to join in the celebration of the Triduum. Do come and join us on this journey. Do come and be part of the greatest event in human history!

The Chrism Mass takes place in

Arundel Cathedral on Wednesday 27th March at 6pm. There is no Mass at 10am in the parish. At the Chrism Mass, the Bishop consecrates the Holy Oils for the following year, which will then be distributed to the various parishes. These are the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens, and the Oil of Chrism, to be used to anoint the sick, those to be baptised and those to be confirmed. All the diocesan priests will be concelebrating and the faithful are invited as well.

On Thursday the Church celebrates

Holy Thursday, when we commemorate the Last Supper, the giving of the Eucharist, the foundation of the priesthood, and the call to serve. Mass is at 8pm, followed by silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose until midnight, when we keep company with Jesus in His Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane on the eve of His Passion. The details of the Liturgy can be found on page 192 of the Yellow books.

This Friday is Good Friday, the day of Jesus's suffering and death on the Cross. The Church will be open for prayer and reflection all day, until dusk. The Liturgy of the Passion is at 3pm, the hour at which Our Lord died, after which the stripping of the altar will take place. Yellow books,

page 197. As usual the collection will be taken for the Holy Places in Jerusalem.

Saturday is a day at watching at the Lord's Tomb, awaiting His Resurrection from the Dead. The Church will be shut all day, but will open in good time for the Easter Vigil, which starts at 8pm outside the Church, as darkness falls, with the Holy Fire. (See yellow books, page 216.) On Sunday the Masses are at the normal times of at 8.30am, 10am and 11.30am, and we will renew our baptismal promises at each one. You may bring your own baptismal candle to this, but candles will also be provided. (Yellow books, page 251.) As you may remember the Easter collection is one of two every year (the other is at Christmas) which is for the support of your parish priest.

Please note weekday Masses will be celebrated on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 10am only until further notice.

Confessions are held on Saturdays from 5.15 to 5.45pm followed by Mass at 6pm.

Thanks to our hard working cleaners who have continued to keep the church looking tidy and a special mention to the thoughtful person who cleaned the brasses, not an easy task.
