We are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are now doing the prophet Jeremiah. This Sunday is the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The prayers and readings are to be found in the yellow books on page 94. The first reading is from the Prophet Jeremiah, who, when surrounded by enemies who are all plotting his downfall, entrusts himself to the Lord. In the Gospel, from Saint Matthew, Jesus instructs His disciples and tell them thrice not to be afraid. They will face many trials in the world, but He will be with them in their mission. The Church, founded by Jesus Christ, receives her mission from Him, and the gates of Hell cannot hold out against her.

This Sunday, there is Children's Liturgy at the 10am Mass.

This Sunday the Confirmation group are meeting for the last time at 7pm. Let us pray for them and their families. The Confirmation is on 2 July at the Cathedral at 3pm.

This Sunday after the 10am Mass, there will be a chance to talk about the future of the Hove parishes in the Hall over coffee. What has emerged over these various conversations? Several things. We need to focus on mission as opposed to maintenance; it is quite possible that the various buildings the Church owns are impeding our mission rather than helping it. We need to be a joyful community that is welcoming to others. This does not mean 'love-bombing' strangers, but it does mean firmly believing the truth of the Gospel and experiencing the joy it brings. We noted that many Churches of the evangelical tradition are doing well. Why is this? It may have something to do with the clear exposition of the treasures of the Christian tradition. Above all, we need to grow our congregation. What should we be doing that we are not currently doing?

Thursday is the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, a Holy Day of Obligation, and our patronal feast as well. Here are all the Masses being celebrated locally:

# Liturgical notes

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We shall be singing some of the hymns to the Sacred Heart. We are in Ordinary Time, which continues until Advent. On days on which there is no feast we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Tuesday is the feast of Saint Cyril of Alexandria.

Wednesday is the feast of Saint Irenaeus. Thursday is the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, a Holy Day of Obligation, and our patronal feast as well.

Friday is the feast of the First Martyrs of the See of Rome.

Confessions are after Mass on Friday morning, at 10.30am. On Saturday Confessions are heard before the evening Mass, at 5.15pm until 5.45pm.

Repeated from last week. We have had our meeting of Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, which was useful and productive. One thing that emerged was the manner of receiving Holy Communion. This is always to be done with the greatest reverence as is fitting for the reception of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ.

People may choose whether to receive the Body of Christ in the hand or on the tongue. When receiving in the hand, the communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: "When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost."

- In the Roman rite intinction, dipping the Host in the Precious Blood, is not the norm. The Body and Blood are received separately.
- No one, under any circumstances whatever, is to walk away holding the Host; rather they should consume the Sacred Host at once, in full view of the altar and the priest or minister of Communion.
- When going up to Holy
  Communion, if someone is sitting
  down, and you need to pass them,
  do so in the normal way, with a
  quiet 'Excuse me' or similar words.
  Do not ask them if they are going
  up to Holy Communion or invite
  them to do so. This is not your
  business, or the business of any
  human being, but a matter between
  them and God alone.

Social dancing happens at 8pm in the Hall on Thursday; all are welcome. On Friday the Social club meets at 1.30pm.

More from the writings of Fr James Martin SJ: Pedro Arrupe, SJ, the former superior general, from a beautiful 1981 talk: "In recent years the very expression 'Sacred Heart' has constantly aroused, from some quarters, emotional, almost allergic reactions, perhaps in part as a reaction against certain means of presentation and terminologies more suited to the tastes of an earlier time. Therefore it seemed to me to be advisable to allow a little time to pass, in the certainty that this attitude, which is emotional rather than rational, should die down somewhat. I have always entertained the conviction that the high value of

this profound spirituality would not be long in re-establishing itself in the esteem of all. For it is a spirituality which successive Roman Pontiffs have classed as 'a supreme spirituality'. It is, moreover one which makes use of a biblical symbol, the heart, which itself is a 'source word' (Urwort). For this reason, and very much in spite of myself, I have spoken and written relatively little about this theme, although I have often dealt with in more personal conversations, and in this devotion I myself possess one of the deepest sources of vitality for my interior life."

In September we have two young ladies, aged twelve, who wish to start catechesis prior to baptism. Are there any other people of the same age of thereabouts who wish to be baptised or receive their First Holy Communion? If so, please speak up before September.

This year marks the 150 anniversary of the opening of Arundel Cathedral. On Saturday 1 July at 12 noon there is going to be a Solemn High Mass to which all parishes have been invited to send two delegates. Our parish will be represented by Peter and Angela Fishenden.
