

We are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are now at the prophet Isaiah. This Sunday is the First Sunday of Lent.

The prayers and readings for today can be found in the yellow books on page 151. The first reading is from the book of Genesis and is the story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, and how they disobey God by eating the forbidden fruit, tempted to do so by the cunning serpent. The Gospel is from Saint Matthew, and is the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, and how he overcomes the cunning of the Devil. So, what was lost in Adam is regained in Christ. The three temptations are to greed for material things (symbolised by bread), to vainglory or showing off (symbolised by throwing oneself off the Temple and being rescued), and to power and domination of others (symbolised by all the kingdoms of the world).

Children's Liturgy takes place at the 10am Mass. It is for children from year minus 1 to First Holy Communion age. Children and parents who wish to take part will be called up after the Gloria and Opening Prayer, and will then process into the Hall. They will return for the Offertory. Children's Liturgy is every Sunday, irrespective of school holidays, except in the months of April, August and December.

In Lent, Confessions are heard after Mass each weekday, that is, starting at 10.30am, and every Saturday before the evening Mass, from 5.15 to 5.45pm.

Liturgical notes

Wednesday is the feast of Saint David, bishop, patron saint of Wales. No Lenten penance on this day.

In the season of Lent, the Church's liturgy is deliberately sober. The vestments are purple, the colour of penitence, on the weekdays and Sundays of Lent. The Gloria is omitted. There is no Alleluia. The organ is used only to support the singing, except on Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent, when Hamish will play at the 6pm Mass. There are no flowers on the altar.

The funeral Mass of Barbara Rozario RIP, formerly of Mortimer Road, Hove, BN3, who died on the 15 February 2023 at the Royal Sussex County Hospital, Brighton, at the age of 87, will be celebrated here on Friday 3 March 2023 at 12 noon, followed by her committal at Woodvale Crematorium at circa 1.30 pm. This will replace the 10am Mass on that day. Let us continue to pray for the repose of Barbara's soul, and for the comfort of her family.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Rosemary Richards, which occurred in Bournemouth on 1 January, and whose daughter is Belinda Formosa. Rosemary was for many years a parishioner here and her ashes will be received into Church at noon on Saturday 25 February. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and for the comfort of her family and friends.

How is your Lent going so far? Have you got a plan? Lent means:

- Fasting: this means going without some food or drink; it can mean denying yourself something that you spent too much time on, such as television, the internet, screen or sleep.
- Almsgiving: don't forget our foodbank, the collection for Lenten alms on Sunday 5 March which will be for the earthquake victim in Syria, and the Cafod Family Fast day on 3 March.
- Prayer: the best prayer is attendance at Mass on Sundays and during the week. In addition, we will have the Stations of the Cross on Fridays. One can pray at home or privately, by saying the Rosary, and meditating on the Scriptures.
- Penance: Go to Confession.

This Friday we are going to be watching the cult classic film Quadrophrenia, which dates from 1979 and which is set in Brighton in 1964 and deals with the clashes between the Mods and the Rockers. This film 'contains adult themes' as they say, and 'strong language' along with violence and other things, so please be aware of this. It is a great film, but you have been warned.

Syria and Turkey: We have already donated £1,000 to the Cafod appeal for the earthquake victims. The retiring collection on Sunday March 5, our Lenten alms, will be for the same cause. Apparently, the government in Syria is refusing charitable donations from abroad, so we are looking into how to make a donation to those in need in Syria in particular. The best way seems to be to donate the collection to Mary's Meals, a charity that works in Aleppo already and which is currently providing food to those in need there.

Roof news: Adrian Egan and his team have put special sealant on the brick work that is exposed to the south winds and rains, which we hope will solve the problem.

Electric news. We have had the estimate from the electrician and asked him to go ahead with the work of renewing the lighting in the Narthex, the link corridor and the Presbytery kitchen. Also to be repaired is one of the lights in the yard area between Hall and sacristy. One feels confident that this will greatly enhance all four environments. On Saturday 18 March at 7pm we will hold a social event for our musicians, with proper wine from Quaff and food. Spouses

proper wine from Quaff and food. Spouses and children of drinking age are invited, and there will be soft drinks for children on nondrinking age. In addition, all music lovers and those who like singing are invited. We shall eat, drink, be merry, and have a singalong of some very well-loved songs. And if that goes well, if you are not a member of the choir, you will be invited to join. The choir members have been primed to invite you!

Sale in the Hall; it runs from 8.30am to lunchtime. This is not a money making exercise, but an opportunity for willing buyers and willing sellers in the community to come together. Last time there were lots of lovely things on sale, so please put the date in your diary. If you want a table, it is £5 for a small one and £7 for a large one. Place the money in an envelope with your name on, and that it is for the Table Top sale, and place it through the letter box of the presbytery, with your contact details if you want receipt to be acknowledged. The table money will be donated to the appeal for the Syrian/Turkish earthquake.
