This Sunday is the Thirteenth Sunday of the Year. The first reading is from the Book of Wisdom and tells us that death was not part of God's plan, but rather brought into the world because of sin and the malice of the devil. This passage reiterates the teaching of the story of the Garden of Eden in the Book of Genesis. In the Gospel Jesus works two miracles: the cure of the woman suffering from the issue of blood, and the raising of the daughter of Jairus to life. This passage reminds us of the bereaved in our midst, and we should all think of what we can do for them. Jesus expels the mourners from Jairus's house because they are, as we say today, 'not helping'. So, what exactly can we do to help? One way is simply not to cut the bereaved off from normal human interaction; the other is more practical; cook

something and take it round to them, which is something done in modern Jewish practice, and which we could usefully copy.

Congratulations to Suzie who won the fabulous Fish created by Debbie, and congratulations to Andrew our organist who won the second prize of the ceramic Horse. Many thanks to the donors of the prizes and all who took part: thanks to your efforts we have raised £474 for our Hall refurbishment project.

This Sunday is Cake Sunday; do buy a cake after the 10am or 11.15am Mass. In addition, as usual, there is coffee and other drinks, all for the Hall!

Liturgical notes

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. From a letter of Pope Benedict XVI on the 50th anniversary of Pope Pius XII's encyclical on the Sacred Heart:

'When we practise this devotion, not only do we recognize God's love with gratitude but we continue to open ourselves to this love so that our lives are ever more closely patterned upon it. God, who poured out his love "into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us", invites us tirelessly to accept his love. The main aim of the invitation to give ourselves entirely to the saving love of Christ and to consecrate ourselves to it is, consequently, to bring about our relationship with God. This explains why the devotion, which is totally oriented to the love of God who sacrificed himself for us, has an irreplaceable importance for our faith and for our life in love. Whoever inwardly accepts God is moulded by him. The experience of God's love should be lived by men and women as a "calling" to which they must respond. Fixing our gaze on the Lord, who "took our infirmities and bore our diseases", helps us to become more attentive to the suffering and need of others. Adoring contemplation of the side pierced by the spear makes us sensitive to God's salvific will. It enables us to entrust ourselves to his saving and merciful love, and at the same time strengthens us in the desire to take part in

his work of salvation, becoming his instruments.'

Monday is the feast of Saint Irenaeus, bishop and martyr.

Tuesday is our patronal feast of Saints Peter and Paul. This year we are not really doing anything for the feast, thanks to the various restrictions and also to having our Hall closed. But do, please, if you can, come to mass on this important feast day.

Wednesday is the feast of the First Martyrs of the See of Rome.

Friday is the feast of Saint Oliver Plunkett, bishop and martyr.

Saturday is the feast of Saint Thomas, apostle.

Of our target of £30,000 for the Hall restoration fund, we have raised the further sum of £143 from the sale of raffle tickets for the Fish and the Horse. In addition, Mary and Mary have made a further stupendous £190.40 from the sale of coffee and delicious things after Mass, which brings our total to £9,025.98 so far. The CCRS offers a very flexible and accessible way of learning, it includes some online content and is made up of eight modules: six core and two specialist modules. Neither is it possible to countersign identity papers for people who one does not know. With regard to baptism and confirmation certificates, requests are best submitted in writing, with a stamped addressed envelope. Please remember to include as

much information as possible, as this makes tracking down the records easier. Dealing with forms does take time, and the parish does not charge for this service, but craves your patience.

Gift Aid Envelopes are now available at the back of the church. Please remember to collect them. Your number may have changed as part of our recent audit, this will not affect your donations. Yellow envelopes are available at the back of the church for anyone who wishes to donate regardless of being a member of our scheme. Thank you for your continued support.

Those Covid Rules:

- The capacity of the church is 100 people: two people per bench, spaced at one metre apart, and one person per chair. (Families can sit together.) Please spread out as widely as possible and do not bunch together.
- Please check in for track and trace purposes, either electronically or in writing.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and exit.
- Please observe the one way system: up the middle, down the sides, especially at Holy Communion.
- If you take a newsletter, please take it home with you.
- There is STILL no congregational singing.
- The Church doors are to remain open to ventilate the building.
- Mass is shorter than usual.
- There is no procession of the Gifts to the altar. Your offering will be taken as you leave the Church.
- There is no sign of peace.
- Holy Communion will be received under one kind only.
- Communion must be given silently, avoiding any physical contact.
- Please remove your mask (if wearing one) and gloves to receive Holy Communion.
- As you leave do not to linger in doorways or other 'choke points'.
- People are urged not to come to the sacristy before and after Mass, unless they are servers or sacristans.
- Face coverings are mandatory for all who are not exempt.
- The Bishops also urge readers to wear disposable gloves.
