We are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are now at the prophet Isaiah. Please visit our website which is constantly being updated.

This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of the

**Year**. The prayers and readings for today can be found in the yellow books on page 130. The first reading is from the prophet Zephaniah, who urges the children of Israel to seek integrity and humility. In the second reading, writing to the church at Corinth, Saint Paul reminds them that at the time of their calling they were perfectly ordinary people, indeed common and contemptible in the eyes of the world. (This passage leads many to suppose that the earliest Christians were predominantly women, children and slaves, groups that were denied Roman citizenship.) The Gospel is Saint Matthew's account of the opening of the Sermon on the Mount, where Jesus proclaims the Beatitudes. All of these follow on from the first one: 'Blessed are the poor in spirit.'

This Sunday, there is another chance to donate to Ukraine, as Armanda will be facepainting in the Hall after 10am Mass and 11.30am Mass, and soliciting donations. Currently, our fundraising for Ukraine stands at £3, 574.

This week, there are two special events.

The first is on Thursday night at 6pm, when we will be celebrating the feast of Candlemas, which commemorates the Presentation of the Lord Jesus in the Temple forty days after His birth. Just as Simeon hailed him as the light of the world, we will do the same and candles will be blessed, with a candlelit procession. The prayers and readings are to be found on page 297 of the yellow books. Mass will be offered for the late Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI and will conclude our commemoration of his life. We will be singing Christmas carols, and after this feast the crib will be removed. After Mass there will be drinks in the Hall.

The second is on Friday, which is the feast of Saint Blaise, when throats are blessed, with two unlit candles, using these words: 'Through the intercession of Saint Blase, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.' The martyr Saint Blaise, according to the story of his life, while on

his way to execution, saved the life of a boy who had a fishbone stuck in his throat. We shall have the Blessing of Throats at the end of the 10am Mass.

You may remember last Sunday the sermon was about the idea of invitation, and how the first four disciples were called and at the same time charged to call others to join the Kingdom. With this in mind, let us keep the invitation idea in our minds. Perhaps we could invite people to Church for one of these special events. More special events are in the pipeline and will be advertised in due course.

Next Sunday, after a very long pause, Children's Liturgy starts again. It is for children from year minus 1 to First Holy Communion age. Children and parents who wish to take part will be called up after the Gloria and Opening Prayer, and will then process into the Hall. They will return for the Offertory. Many thanks to the volunteers who have made this possible.

Readers present and future are invited to gather on Monday 6 February at 7pm. If you are able to come, and we hope you can, please indicate with an email to the parish priest. Remember, if you are baptised, you are a prophet, priest and king, and commissioned to proclaim the Word to others.

Confessions are heard after Mass each Friday, that is, starting at 10.30am, and every Saturday before the evening Mass, from 5.15 to 5.45pm.
