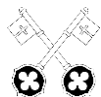
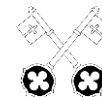

This Sunday is the Twenty-Seventh

Sunday of the Year, and the readings can be found in the blue Mass books on page 140. The first reading is from the Book of Genesis, which explains to us that marriage, the exclusive lifelong union between man and woman, is something that God ordained since the beginning. In the Gospel, Jesus explains that man and woman become one flesh when they are joined in marriage, and that what is joined in this way cannot be unjoined, therefore divorce, which was allowed by Moses, is in fact not possible. What God has joined together, let no one put asunder, as we say in the wedding ceremony.

As a result of this, and because our consignment of Rosaries is still on the way, Rosary Sunday will be held next Sunday, 10 October. On this day the prayers of the Mass, though not the readings, will be taken from the feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. Please take a leaflet, available at the back of the Church, that explains how to say the Rosary, and do pass one on to someone who may find it useful. We also have numerous rosaries to give away, so please make sure you get yours.

Last Sunday's fundraiser for Cruse, the sale of delicious Italian home made products by Luigi and Fabiana made the sum of £253 for Cruse. Well done to all involved!

A visitor from Worthing gave us £10 for the Hall refurbishment. A kind parishioner has presented us with a cheque for £300. This means the running total for the Hall is now £15, 741.32. This Sunday we are holding yet another raffle! Some kind people have given us a digital bread maker. These usually cost around £100. Tickets are £1 each, and the draw will be made next Sunday. This Sunday, our Lusophone brethren will be celebrating Mass at 5pm.

This Sunday is the third of four census Sundays. The congregation will be counted as you leave Mass. Please let the clickers see you as you do so, and so not distract them in their very challenging task. Last Sunday the figures were as follows, with the previous Sunday's figures given first:

That makes a total of 334 (compare last week's 301) spread over four Masses. In the next few weeks, please do encourage yourselves and everyone else to come and be counted.

Next Sunday is the Twenty-Eighth Sunday of the Year, and at the start of the 11.15am Mass we will be **unveiling and blessing the picture of the Blessed Carlo Acutis** that John Armstrong has painted for us, and given to the Church. Let

us pray for John, our benefactor! This day falls on the anniversary of the beatification of Carlo a year ago in Assisi. In future years, we hope, the feast of Carlo will be kept on the 12 October, which is the anniversary of his birth into eternal life. In the meantime, let us use this picture as a focus of our devotion, given that numerous prayers have been answered through the intercession of the young Blessed. Novenas are available at the back of the Church as are holy pictures.

There was a serious mistake in last week's newsletter. The Mass intention for 'Kay Doyle, recently deceased' was received and entered as usual, but this is nothing to do with Kaye Doyle, a member of the Union of Catholic Mothers. Many apologies for the confusion and upset that has resulted.

Liturgical notes

The month of October is dedicated to prayer for the Missions of the Church and it is also the month of the Holy Rosary. On days when there is no feast we shall celebrate the Mass for the Progress of Peoples, or the Evangelisation of Peoples, or for persecuted Christians. Because it is the month of the Holy Rosary we shall say the Rosary after every weekday mass when there is no funeral.

Monday is the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. The patron saint of Italy, Francis of Assisi was a poor little man who astounded and inspired the Church by taking the gospel literally—not in a narrow fundamentalist sense, but by actually following all that Jesus said and did, joyfully, without limit, and without a sense of self-importance.

Serious illness brought the young Francis to see the emptiness of his frolicking life as leader of Assisi's youth. Prayer—lengthy

and difficult—led him to a self-emptying like that of Christ, climaxed by embracing a leper he met on the road. It symbolized his complete obedience to what he had heard in prayer: "Francis! Everything you have loved and desired in the flesh it is your duty to despise and hate, if you wish to know my will. And when you have begun this, all that now seems sweet and lovely to you will become intolerable and bitter, but all that you used to avoid will turn itself to great sweetness and exceeding joy." From the cross in the neglected field-chapel of San Damiano, Christ told him, "Francis, go out and build up my house, for it is nearly falling down." Francis became the totally poor and humble workman. He must have suspected a deeper meaning to "build up my house." He gave up all his possessions. He was, for a time, considered to be a religious fanatic, begging from door to door when he could not get money for his work, evoking sadness or disgust to the hearts of his former friends, ridicule from the unthinking. But genuineness will tell. A few people began to realize that this man was actually trying to be Christian. He really believed what Jesus said: "Announce the kingdom! Possess no gold or silver or copper in your purses, no traveling bag, no sandals, no staff" (Luke 9:1-3). Francis' first rule for his followers was a collection of texts from the Gospels. He had no intention of founding an order, but once it began he protected it and accepted all the legal structures needed to support it. His devotion and loyalty to the Church were absolute and highly exemplary. Francis was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News. He decided in favour of the latter, but always returned to solitude when he could.

During the last years of his relatively short life, he died at 44, Francis was half blind and seriously ill. Two years before his death he received the stigmata, the real and painful wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side. On his deathbed, Francis asked his superior's permission to have his clothes removed when the last hour came in order that he could expire lying naked on the earth, in imitation of his Lord.

Wednesday is the feast of Saint Bruno. Saturday is the feast of Saint John Henry Newman.
