

We are preparing ourselves for the Synod with a series of meetings in Advent, which will take place in the Upper Room at 7.30 pm on 30 November, 7 December, 14 December and 21 December. These meetings will be chaired by Kate Williamson and will use material prepared by the diocese. From an interview with Cardinal Grech on the upcoming Synod.

The Holy Father has said the upcoming synod on synodality is not about “gathering opinions,” but “listening to the Holy Spirit.” How will participants be able to discern what the Holy Spirit is telling us, and how much will the Church’s teaching and tradition inform that discernment?

Synodality is as old as the Church herself. In the first millennium of the Church’s history, it was taken for granted that the only infallible ecclesial subject was the People of God who, as a whole, could not err in matters of belief; and this because all of the baptized have received the Holy Spirit as gift. The *sensus fidei* runs throughout the Church’s entire history. In fact, in the second millennium, the popes had recourse to the *sensus fidei* in their definitions of the Marian dogmas.

What does it mean to be the Church of the third millennium? Is it about adjusting the Church to the spirit of the times, or rather having the world adjust to the wisdom of the Church’s teaching?


The Church of the third millennium cannot be the repetition of the Church of the second millennium, just as the Church of the second millennium could not be the repetition of the Church of the first millennium. As a historical subject, the Church of Christ deepens its own identity through the centuries, in order to draw ever closer to the will of its Founder. As Benedict XVI said in 2005, the Church is a subject that always renews itself in continuity. Therefore,

continuity and renewal are not opposed, rather they are complementary. The goal of the Church is not to adjust itself to the “spirit of times,” but to listen to this “spirit” to discern within what the “Spirit,” the Holy Spirit, might be communicating to the Christian community in order to be more faithful to Christ.

This Sunday is the feast of All Saints which is being anticipated this year, as 1 November, the usual day, is on Monday. The prayers and readings can be found in the blue Mass books on page 186. The first reading comes from the Apocalypse of Saint John and describes the huge number of people from every race, tribe nation and tongue who are gathered around the throne of the Lamb. This is a sign to us of the universal call to holiness, which is felt by people of all times and places and draws them near to God. The Gospel, from Saint Matthew, is the

Beatitudes, in which Jesus spells out the blessed state of those who follow Him, and in which He outlines the way His followers should live. The point of this feast is to commemorate all those faithful Christians who have pleased God, and who, though not canonised saints, or even well known, are now rejoicing in His presence for ever. At the same time, we contemplate our vocation to be with God forever in heavenly glory.

On Friday 22 October all the priests and deacons who were able gathered with Bishop Richard and members of the diocesan safeguarding team, and here are a few points one took away from the meeting, which may be of interest.

- The diocese employs four full time staff to deal with safeguarding matters; three of them have backgrounds in the police; they are paid for by, ultimately, your contributions to the parish, a proportion of which are sent to the diocese. This is a sign of the way the diocese takes safeguarding seriously.
- Safeguarding is not an add on to parish life but integral to it and to the message of the Gospel.
- Everyone in ministry needs to be aware of safeguarding issues and is invited to/needs to undertake training in this regard. (For some it is mandatory, for others not, depending on the ministry.)
- Here at Saint Peter's we need to appoint a deputy to the Parish Rep, who is Aisling Brombley.
- The diocese is aware that many parishes are short of volunteers and it does not want safeguarding checks to put people off volunteering, but nevertheless they are essential in many roles. If you have been asked to bring your DBS up to date, then we need to hear from you, so we can then pass this on to the diocese, who are waiting to hear from us.

- Safeguarding is the duty of us all, not just Reps, diocesan authorities and clergy.
- Very soon we want to start Children's Liturgy again. For this we need volunteers who have to have a DBS check. Moreover, parents who want their children to come to Children's Liturgy must give their written consent. If you are interested in this, we very much want to hear from you.
- On the whole the day was very positive, and it was the first in person meeting since the pandemic began.

Liturgical notes

The month of November is dedicated to prayer for the faithful departed. On days when there is no feast we shall celebrate the daily Mass for the Dead.

Tuesday is the Commemoration of All Souls. A plenary indulgence applicable to the souls in Purgatory may be obtained under the usual conditions on this day by visiting a Church and saying the Our Father and the Creed. A plenary indulgence also applicable to the Holy Souls may be obtained under the usual conditions by those who visit a cemetery from 1-8 November and pray for the faithful departed.

Wednesday is the feast of Saint Martin de Porres.

Let us pray for Father Ken McCarthy who died on Thursday 21 October in Epsom hospital, aged 92. Fr McCarthy was ordained on 31 May 1953. Before the creation of the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton, he served in the parishes of Tunbridge Wells, Kingston, and Dover.

When Arundel and Brighton came into being, he continued his priestly apostolate in Brighton (St Mary Magdalen), Langley Green, Seaford, and Hailsham, before his retirement in 1999. May he rest in peace. Holy Mass is being offered for him here on Sunday 7 November at 8.30am.

Please note that the funeral Mass of John Southworth will take place here on All Souls Day, 2 November, at 11am. The coffin will be commended for cremation at the Church door after the Requiem Mass. Let us pray for the repose of his soul and the comfort of his family. This Mass will replace the 10am Mass on that day.


The Charity of the Southwark
