- From this Sunday we have Bidding Prayers! As soon as possible we need two readers per Sunday instead of one.

This Sunday is the Fourteenth Sunday of the Year. The first reading is from the prophet Ezekiel and recounts his commission from the Lord to the people of Israel, to whom God sends him, knowing that many will refuse to listen. In the Gospel Jesus goes to His home town of Nazareth, and finds that the people there reject His message because they feel they know him too well: familiarity has bred contempt, as we say. These passages should lead us to consider the problem of unbelief amongst our contemporaries.

Today, it being the Sunday after the feast of Saints Peter and Paul, there is the annual retiring collection for Peter's Pence, which is taken up in every Catholic Church in the world, and goes to support the administrative

costs of the Holy See, which is the central government of the Church.

On Sunday evening, the Confirmation

candidates are gathering with their catechists in Wish Park. (Please meet in the very centre.) The idea is to have a picnic, play games, and do various activities making use of the long hours of daylight. This starts at 7pm and ends at 8.15pm.

Those not up to the walk can join us there having made the pilgrimage by bus. The point of this pilgrimage is partly ecumenical, and partly an attempt to pray, and social, as it will enable those who take part to get to know each other. We hope to meet up with one of the parish clergy from St Mary's when we arrive.

Let us continue to pray for the repose of the soul of **Thomas McCauley** and the comfort of his wife family. The funeral Mass will be at 2.30pm on Friday 9 July, followed by committal at Woodvale crematorium. This will not affect the 10am mass that morning.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Dorothy Citrone, who died on June 17, in Worthing Hospital, aged 87. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and the comfort of her family. Her funeral will take place at the Downs Crematorium on Monday 12 July at 2pm.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Chris Buckingham, who died at home on Saturday 26 June, having received the sacrament of the Sick and the Apostolic Pardon. He was 63 years old, and had been ill for some time. Let us pray for the repose

of his soul and for the comfort of his widow Lorraine at this sad time. His funeral Mass will take place here on Friday 16 July at 11am, which will replace the 10am Mass on that day.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Patricia O'Loughlin who died in Lindridge Care Home on 19th June aged 93 years. Her funeral will take place on Monday 12th July, Downs Crematorium, 3pm. Let us pray for the repose of her soul and for the comfort of her family at this difficult time.

Liturgical notes

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Christ. On days when there is no feast we will be celebrating a Votive Mass of the Precious Blood. This devotion reminds us of the Passion of Our Lord and of the way we are redeemed through the Precious Blood of the Lamb.

Monday is the feast of Saint Antony Mary Zaccaria.

Tuesday is the feast of Saint Maria Goretti, martyr. She is the youngest canonized saint in the Church. She died tragically on July 6, 1902, at the age of eleven. Born into poverty, her father moved the family when Maria was just six years old from the east side of Italy (near Ancona) to the west side (near Nettuno, about 40 miles south of Rome) in hopes of escaping the grinding poverty that was gripping the area. Just three years later, when Maria was nine, her father died. It fell to her at that time to raise her five siblings while her mother worked the fields to produce the crops with which they would both pay the rent and feed themselves. Aside from having the responsibility of caring for her family, she had to also cook and clean for her two next door neighbours—Giovanni Serenelli and his

son, Alessandro – who assisted her mother with the farm tasks. It was also during this time that Alessandro began to develop an impure liking for Maria. The big 20-year-old would say rude and crude things to her, things that were inappropriate and embarrassing, and that would cause her to run away. However, at a certain point he began to make direct advances towards her, demanding her virginity and threatening her with violence. Finally, after many months of this, Alessandro forced himself upon Maria in an attempt to rape her. Though she prevented him from violating her, Alessandro brutally stabbed her numerous times. Maria died the next day in the midst of horrendous infection brought on by her lacerations. Her last words were, "I forgive Alessandro Serenelli ... and I want him with me in heaven forever." During his prison sentence Maria appeared to Alessandro in a vision and forgave him. Alessandro repented and from that point on, he lived a life of holiness, eventually becoming a Franciscan lay brother. On June 24, 1950 Maria was canonised by Pope Pius XII in St. Peter's Square, before a congregation of half a million, which included the Saint's mother, and Alessandro Serenelli.

Friday is the feast of Saint Augustine Zhao Rong and companions, martyr of China.

Neither is it possible to countersign identity papers for people who one does not know. With regard to baptism and confirmation certificates, requests are best submitted in writing, with a stamped addressed

envelope. Please remember to include as much information as possible, as this makes tracking down the records easier. Dealing with forms does take time, and the parish does not charge for this service, but craves your patience.

Gift Aid Envelopes are now available at the back of the church. Please remember to collect them. Your number may have changed as part of our recent audit, this will not affect your donations. Yellow envelopes are available at the back of the church for anyone who wishes to donate regardless of being a member of our scheme. Thank you for your continued support.

Those Covid Rules:

- The capacity of the church is 100 people: two people per bench, spaced at one metre apart, and one person per chair. (Families can sit together.) Please spread out as widely as possible and do not bunch together.
- Please check in for track and trace purposes, either electronically or in writing.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and exit.
- Please observe the one way system: up the middle, down the sides, especially at Holy Communion.
- If you take a newsletter, please take it home with you.
- There is STILL no congregational singing.
- The Church doors are to remain open to ventilate the building.
- Mass is shorter than usual.
- There is no procession of the Gifts to the altar. Your offering will be taken as you leave the Church.
- There is no sign of peace.
- Holy Communion will be received under one kind only.
- Communion must be given silently, avoiding any physical contact.
- Please remove your mask (if wearing one) and gloves to receive Holy Communion.
- As you leave do not to linger in doorways or other 'choke points'.
- People are urged not to come to the sacristy before and after Mass, unless they are servers or sacristans.
- Face coverings are mandatory for all who are not exempt.
- The Bishops also urge readers to wear disposable gloves.
