Right now we are doing a virtual Walking Tour Through the Bible, starting with the Book of Genesis, in bite size chunks. We are currently on the Second Book of Samuel. This Sunday is the Second Sunday of Advent. The prayers and readings can be found in the purple Mass books on page 84. The first reading comes from the prophecy of Baruch, who speaks of the return of the Israelites to their own land, and the way that God will smooth the path for them by filling in the valleys and flattening the mountains. This phrasing is evoked too in the Gospel, from Luke, where we are told of the appearance of John the Baptist, who comes to prepare a way for the Lord. John offers a baptism for

the repentance of sins, which is a pointer to us of the penitential nature of the Advent season, when we are invited to repent for our sins, the better to welcome the Lord at Christmas.

There is Children's Liturgy at the 10am Mass. Participants will be called out at the appropriate moment. Thanks to those who have volunteered to help. Would anyone else like to do so?

Liturgical notes

Advent is a penitential season, hence the vestments are purple, there are no flowers on the altar, and there is no Gloria. (The Creed will be sung at the 11.15am Mass.) We have an Advent wreath, the work of Mireille. It is rather delicate, so please do not attempt to move it for any reason. Each candle represents one of the Sundays of Advent and the final candle represents the feast of Christmas. The greenery represents our hope of eternal life. The circle represents eternity. Our Crib will be built in the usual place by Debbie and her team on the afternoon of Sunday 12 December. If you can bring in some greenery that day, it would be appreciated. On the Friday of the third week of Advent we aim to put up our Christmas trees, in time for the Carols on the Sunday. This would be a great opportunity for those who love such things to help. Do come along at 4pm. And at Christmas the statue of Baby Jesus will be making its appearance!

This Advent we are celebrating a Rorate Mass once a week. You are all invited to come to Mass on Wednesdays in Advent at 7am, and bring candles in jam jars for light. After Mass we can, if desired, go out to breakfast.

Monday is the feast of Saint Nicholas, patron saint of children.

Tuesday is the feast of Saint Ambrose.

Wednesday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

Friday is the feast of Our Lady of Loreto.

Saturday is the feast of Saint Damasus I, pope.

Looking ahead to Christmas..... The feast of the Nativity this year falls on a Saturday. As in past years there will be five Masses over Christmas, as laid down below, and the usual Sunday morning Masses on 26 December. However, there will be no Mass on the evening of Christmas Day. - Sunday 26 December: Mass at 8.30am, 10am, and 11.15am. Lusophone Mass at 5pm.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Stephanie Fromholz, who died in Worthing in October, and who was for many years a member of this parish. Let us pray for her eternal repose, and let us remember her family in our prayers. We have also heard the sad news of the death of Pauline Penfold, on Friday 26 November, in hospital in Worthing.

Pauline was a daily Mass-goer, before ill-health overtook her. She had received the Sacrament of the Sick. May she rest in peace, and let us pray for the comfort of her husband John.

We have heard the sad news of the death of Robert Scahill who died at home in Westbourne Gardens on 29 November, aged 88 years, having received the Sacrament of the Sick and the Apostolic Pardon. His funeral service will take place at Woodvale Crematorium (South Chapel) on Thursday 16 December at 11.30 am. Let us pray for the repose of his soul and the comfort of his family.

The Care Group met on Tuesday 30 November at 7.30pm in the presbytery. This is the group that tries to ensure that all who are in need are getting the attention they deserve, particularly the sick and the housebound. The number of people at home and unwell is increasing and we do need suitable people to help.

The Social Club meets on Fridays at 1.30pm and meets for two hours. Both are meant to be fun social occasions. Do please bring all your

friends with you. On Friday 10 December, our resident accordionist Clive will be leading us in a festive sing-song. On Friday 17 December, before breaking for Christmas, Aidan Goodwin, our local PCSO, will join us to talk about the dangers of scams and how to avoid them.

There are several children in the parish who, for whatever reason, have missed the usual catechism classes for Holy Communion, or who have not been baptised before the age of seven. For such children we are proposing a tailored catechism class in Lent, so they can celebrate the Sacraments at Easter. Lent next year begins on Wednesday March 2 and Easter is on Sunday 17 April. The classes will take place on Saturdays of Lent at 4.45pm. If you would like to join this group, then please make your interest known to Father Alexander.

If you are a reader, a Eucharistic minister, on duty at Mass, please come into the sacristy for prayers before the Mass begins at about seven minutes prior to the start.
