

Looking ahead: Now that the Jubilee and Confirmation are over, we are not having any major events between now and the autumn, as perhaps we all deserve a little break. However.... The charity Lepra, which looks after those suffering from leprosy, which is still an all too common disease, has asked us to have a collection and this will take place on Sunday 9 October, which is the Twenty-Eight Sunday of the Year, when the gospel of Jesus healing the ten lepers is read out. Lepra has asked us for an appeal before, and it seems a good idea to connect this charitable enterprise with the root and foundation of all charity, Jesus the Lord, who cared for and healed lepers.

Secondly, we need to think about Stewardship. This is a weighty theological term and means the way we look after what has been entrusted to us by God. There are three Sundays coming up – the Twenty-Fifth, Twenty-Sixth and Twenty-Seventh of the Year (18 September, 25 September and 2 October) – when the following gospels are read: that of the Bad Steward, that of Dives and Lazarus, and that of the servants who expect no thanks but are merely doing their duty. On these three Sundays we shall consider the question of stewardship, and perhaps by the third have an appeal for people to volunteer their time and their skills to help the parish. Often stewardship is thought of to do with fundraising, but you may have noticed that after the stained glass appeal and the Hall appeal we have an unofficial moratorium on fundraising. Rather we shall concentrate on contributions of a non-monetary nature, inspired by the values of the gospel which we hear read and want to put into action.

This Sunday we celebrate Pentecost, the feast that falls fifty days after Easter, and when the Holy Spirit came upon Our Lady and the disciples gathered in prayer in the Upper Room.

This is, after Easter and Christmas, the third most important feast of the Christian year. This year, Pentecost will see the culmination of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. The 11.15am Mass will be one of Thanksgiving, as mandated by the

bishops of England and Wales, with suitable music. For the prayers and readings of Pentecost, please see the purple books, page 294. The first reading is Saint Luke's account of the giving of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost day, fifty days after Easter, to the nascent Church in the Upper Room. In the Gospel, Jesus consigns the Spirit to the disciples on the evening of Easter day, giving them to power to forgive sins, and sending them forth on their mission.

Today there is a retiring collection for the Catholic Communications network, which supports those working in the apostolate of the mass media.

This Sunday evening, we conclude our celebrations with the Grand Jubilee Concert. It starts at 7pm, and will be followed by refreshments in the Hall. The programme is as follows:

The month of June is the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart, and on days when there is no feast we shall celebrate a Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart. Monday is the feast of Our Lady, Mother of the Church, which always falls the day after Pentecost. This feast recalls the central role Mary played in waiting for the Spirit to come and praying with the disciples in the Upper Room.

Many many thanks to all who helped with the Confirmation, and made it such a success. Lots of people said that they thought the Mass was wonderful. One was struck by the lovely music and the reverent atmosphere, and the Bishop's sermon was short and to the point. Above all, our confirmation candidates behaved impeccably and took full part in the Liturgy. Many congratulations to them. And, as you may have heard, next year Confirmation will be at the Cathedral, which is celebrating its 150 anniversary.

First Holy Communion: The time has come to activate our plans for this for the coming scholastic year 2022/2023. There will be three courses, one each term. The first course is going to be on Saturdays from 10th September to 26th November inclusive (but not the two Saturdays that fall within the half term holiday). Each session will be from 9.15am to 10.45am. This allows for ten sessions; it is possible that the material may be covered in fewer than 10 sessions; we shall see. First Holy Communion will be celebrated on Advent Sunday, which falls on Sunday 27 November, at the 11.15am Mass. Numbers are limited. If you wish for a place for your child (and this course is for children accompanied by at least one parent), then please get in contact with Fr Alexander by email as soon as possible. In January another course will begin; and a further course will take place in the summer term; these courses may be on Saturday mornings, or may be on a weekday afternoon, or even a Saturday afternoon, if these times turn out to be more convenient for parties concerned. Again, we shall see. Candidates for first Holy Communion should be in year three and above by the beginning of the new term in September. As a consequence of the above, the 10am Mass on Saturdays will cease from the end of August, and confessions will be rerouted to the Saturday evening, before the 6pm Mass.
