I There is no procession of the Gifts to the altar and no passing around of the collection baskets. Your offering will be taken as you leave the Church.

I There is no sign of peace.

I Holy Communion will be received under one kind only.

© Communion must be given silently, avoiding any physical contact.

Please remove your mask (if wearing one) to receive Holy Communion.

As you leave do not to linger in doorways or other 'choke points'.

I Once Mass is over the Church will be closed and cleaned.

People are urged not to come to the sacristy before and after Mass, unless they are servers

or sacristans.



This Sunday is the Second Sunday of

Advent. It has been designated Bible Sunday, a day on which all are encouraged to get to know the Holy Scriptures better. This Sunday is the 39th anniversary of the death of Father Edward Dilger, former parish priest of Angmering and Knaphill, among other places. Back in 1963 he baptised Fr Alexander. May he rest in peace. Let us pray for his soul and all the clergy who have served the diocese over the years.

Fr Alexander writes: Public worship

resumed on Wednesday 2 December. Indications are that it will not be interrupted again. Let us all remember that there has been no evidence of anyone putting themselves at risk of infection by visiting a Church or taking part in Mass in this country. We continue to take stringent precautions to keep the risk of infection to a minimum. There is light at the end of the tunnel in that several vaccines seem 'ready to go'. Let us pray for the wellbeing of the entire community, the sick, the bereaved, those facing unemployment and financial difficulty, all those who are facing disrupted education and work, and all those who are facing mental illness. This has been a very hard time for many people, socially and financially. It has also been hard for pubs, restaurants, small shops and churches. Just as you have been urged to eat out to help out, please support your local Church!

In the meantime, we are gearing up for Christmas. There will be difficulties along the way, but these can be coped with. Here are some points to note.

• The Church is freezing cold (well, it was never warm) thanks to the doors being open, even if the heating is on. This is because ventilation is thought to be an important factor in stopping the spread of Covid. Because of the cold, please dress accordingly. Because of the cold, woolly and other hats may be worn by men and boys, dispensing from the ancient law about men uncovering their heads in Church, while the doors remain open. (It would be fitting, however, to be bareheaded at funerals and going up to Holy Communion.)

• The Crib is going up soon! Many thanks to our crib builders and arrangers. The trees are organised.

• The Advent wreath is in position. As in the past, please do not attempt to move or even touch it, as it is delicate.

• On the last Sunday of Advent, we are having our 'Open Afternoon' of Music, Carols and Readings. The idea is that you drop in for a period of quiet listening, prayer, and a chance to see the crib, and the Baby Jesus which will be displayed on the altar. There is no formal beginning, middle or end (starts at 4pm and ends at 6pm), come and go as you please. Please invite all your friends. Next week we shall have posters available to take away.

• Christmas is a feast that lasts Twelve Days, starting on the 25 December, and ending with the Epiphany on the 6 January. Given this is the case, please think about 'spreading yourself' during the 12 days in your Church attendance. See the next point.

• After considerable thought, having looked at what other parishes have done and are doing, we have decided not to have a booking system for any Mass, including those over the Christmas season. It is first come, first served, and the Church's capacity is 100 persons or 100 'bubbles', provided the latter allows for social distancing. When capacity is reached, the stewards on the door will turn people away or ask them to stand outside. Naturally, we count on your co-operation with the stewards in this matter. We have no way of knowing which Masses will be more in demand. Traditionally, the 6pm has been the most popular; if you are able to do so, you might like to consider 'rerouting' yourself to another Mass.

A note on Mass intentions: Bishop Richard has reminded the clergy that according to Canon Law, no priest can take more than one Mass stipend per day. This means on days when the priest normally says more than one Mass, if there is a second intention the stipend should be passed on to some worthy cause. Incidentally, in accord with Canon Law, we always have one Mass on Sunday (which carries no stipend) for the wellbeing of the parish. Currently our Mass intentions are more or less booked up for the rest of 2020 (though there are some spaces). We have a diary for 2021 already, and if you want to book Mass intentions for key dates, now is the time to do it, to avoid disappointment. Envelopes are as always at the back of the Church.

Liturgical Notes: We are in the season of Advent, a time of intense preparation for the coming of Our Lord at Christmas. This is a penitential season, so there are no flowers on the altar, and there is no Gloria on Sundays; the vestments are violet, the colour of penance. We celebrate several important feasts this week. Something about them can always be found on our website or on our Facebook page. Monday is the feast of Saint Ambrose, bishop and doctor of the Church. Tuesday is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Saturday is the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas, and of indigenous peoples.

The Blessed Carlo Acutis said: "By standing before the Eucharistic Christ, we become holy."

We are still collecting donations for the Food Bank. Please leave your donation in the tub inside the door of the Outer Sacristy. If locked, by the door.

Our next Baptism Course will be on

Monday 14 December at 8pm in the hall. If you want to come, and you have a baby to be baptised, do please contact Fr Alexander first (email is best) and he will arrange to meet up with you.

Let us pray for the repose of the soul of Madeleine Cockell who died on Tuesday 1 December at the Victoria Chatsworth Nursing Home in Dyke Road. She was 96 years old. Details of her funeral, which will take place at Saint Peter's, will be announced when known.

Thanks to Vincent's skill with a computer

and a printer, we now have Holy Pictures of the Blessed Carlo Acutis. They are at the back of the Church. Do please take one, and use it! You might like to pass one on to a suitable recipient. Many are those who have prayed to the Blessed Carlo and received great blessings in so doing. His beatification represents a sign of hope for the Church, and so will his canonisation, when it comes. We have also printed out more Novenas. Prayer to Blessed Carlo at this point, between his beatification and Canonisation may well be particularly fruitful.

On Friday 11 December Fr Alexander will be talking about his recent trip to Assisi and Italy in general. All are invited.

We have just had the meeting of the Care Group. One thing that came up is the plight of the bereaved in our parish. We are going to have the last Mass of the year for them, as we did last year, on the feast of Saint Sylvester, 31 December. We have records, of course, of all the funerals that took place in the parish, but there are several parishioners who lost friends and family whose funerals took place elsewhere. We know some of you, but not all. If you can inform us of bereaved families who would appreciate an invitation to the Mass for the bereaved, then please tell Fr Alexander or another member of the group (email, written message, text is best). The Mass will be at noon, and there will be no music, and, unfortunately, no gathering afterwards. Names for inclusion in the list of the departed in the Eucharistic Prayer can be submitted nearer the time.
