**This Sunday is the feast of Corpus Christi.** The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ the Lord. This day is a celebration of the real presence of Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. The first reading tells us of the Blood of Covenant, described in the Book of Exodus, that ratified the covenant between God and Israel. In the Gospel we hear Saint Mark's account of the Last Supper, and how Jesus' Blood is also the Blood of the Covenant, sealing a New Covenant between God and all the baptised. Today we are hearing a pastoral letter from Bishop Richard, instead of a sermon.

**This Sunday at 6pm,** our Eastern Orthodox brethren will be celebrating the

Divine Liturgy. The celebrant will be Abouna Michel. It will be the month's mind of Amal Shammass RIP. Let us keep her and her family in our prayers.

### Liturgical notes

The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. From a letter of Pope Benedict XVI on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pope Pius XII's encyclical on the Sacred Heart: 'Indeed, to take up a saying of my venerable Predecessor John Paul II, "In the Heart of Christ, man's heart learns to know the genuine and unique meaning of his life and of his destiny, to understand the value of an

authentically Christian life, to keep himself from certain perversions of the human heart, and to unite the filial love for God and the love of neighbour". Thus: "The true reparation asked by the Heart of the Saviour will come when the civilization of the Heart of Christ can be built upon the ruins heaped up by hatred and violence"

Wednesday is the feast of Saint Ephraem, deacon.

Friday is the feast of the Most Sacred heart of Jesus.

Saturday is the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

**We have heard the sad news of the death of Pasqualina Capozzi**, who died at home on Wednesday 2 June, having received the Sacrament of the Sick some days before. May she rest in peace, and may God comfort her family at this difficult time. Her Requiem Mass will be held here, on Monday 21 June at 11am, to be followed by cremation at the Downs. This will replace the 10am Mass on that day.

**We have also heard the sad news of the death of Eric Jenner**, who died on 31 May. Let us pray for the repose of the soul and the comfort of his family. Eric's Requiem Mass will take place here on Monday 28 June at 10.30am, followed by burial at Hove cemetery. This will replace the 10am mass on that day.

**Of our target of £30,000 for the Hall** restoration fund, we have raised the further sum of £500 from the sale of the lights in the Hall. Many thanks to the parishioner who advised us of their resale value. We have received the kind and generous donation of £20, and Mary and

Mary have made a stupendous £152.30 from the sale of coffee and delicious things after Mass, which brings our total to £7,733.13 so far. For updates of progress of the hall refurbishment, please do check out our social media accounts. We will be showing week by week pictures of how things are going.

**Anyone got any other talents** that they would like to use to raise money for the Hall, or bring people together? While on the topic, when the Hall reopens it will have lots more natural light. This means that on certain occasions we will need blackout curtains for the windows that face due east. Is there anyone in the parish that might like to consider making these for us?

**Advance notice: Fr Alexander** is going away from the 22 to 24 June. This means there will be no Mass on Wednesday 23 June.

**We are collecting donations for the Food Bank.** Please leave your donation in the tub inside the door of the Outer Sacristy. If locked, by the door.

**First Holy Communion begins** this October. Fr Alexander has started visiting all the candidates at home with their parents. Don't miss out! He is looking forward to seeing you all.

**Our next baptism class** will be on Monday 14 June at 8pm. Because the Hall is out of use, it will take place in the Church. If you have a baby to baptise, then you need to see Father Alexander before enrolling on the course, and he will come and visit you at home.

**Given the reduced threat from Covid**, we are normalising the manner of celebrating Mass. Let us remember to keep the ventilation to a maximum. To this end the windows and the doors are open. Let us also not cluster together. As last Sunday, the collectors will carry round the baskets for your offerings, at the time of the Offertory. Just put your offering in the basket, if you can reach it, which we hope you can, without actually passing the baskets from hand to hand. Also, as last Sunday, the priest can now say 'The Body of Christ' to communicants, who should respond 'Amen.' This Sunday we aim to have at least one Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist at each Mass for the distribution of Holy Communion. To that end, if you are an EM and wish to have the letter of appointment, as requested by the diocese, please speak to Fr Alexander. The next steps to take will be the return to the Offertory procession, and the return of the Bidding Prayers.

**We do not yet have Bidding Prayers** at Mass, but people have suggested we pray for certain intentions, among which are:

- This week marks the International Day of Innocent Children Victims of Aggression. Let us remember especially the most vulnerable of all children, the unborn. We pray that as a society we would take on the duty to protect all children from harm, and ensure that they arrive into a world where they are loved and supported by all.
- The people of Tigray Province, Ethiopia, and the wellbeing of Fr Teum Berhe, who is ministering there.

- Peace and reconciliation in the Holy Land.
- Political prisoners in Hong Kong, especially Jimmy Lai.
- The people of India, facing a dire Covid crisis, and the various nations around the world which do not have an adequate supply of vaccines.
- The sick of the parish, and all those who are looking after them.
- All students facing exams at this time of years, all who are teaching them, and their families.
- All people who are facing hardship and unemployment thanks to the pandemic.

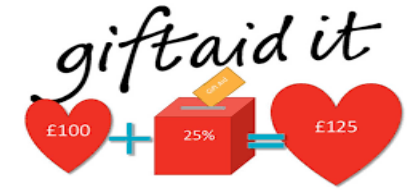

**We are getting lots of passport forms** and other forms to sign. Aisling has kindly taken this on. Please note that forms should be dropped off in office hours only, and all the details need to be filled in before submission for signature or counter-signature and stamping. They will then be handed back to you also during office hours, within a reasonable time. It is not possible to offer a while you wait service. Neither is it possible to countersign identity papers for people who one does not know. With regard to baptism and confirmation certificates, requests are best submitted in writing, with a stamped addressed envelope. Please remember to include as much information as possible, as this makes tracking down the records easier. Dealing with forms does take time, and the parish does not charge for this service, but craves your patience.

### Those Covid Rules:

- The capacity of the church is 100 people: two people per bench, spaced at one metre apart, and one person per chair. (Families can sit together.) Please spread out as widely as possible and do not bunch together.
- Please check in for track and trace purposes, either electronically or in writing.
- Please sanitise your hands on entry and exit.

- Please observe the one way system: up the middle, down the sides, especially at Holy Communion.
- If you take a newsletter, please take it home with you.
- There is STILL no congregational singing.
- The Church doors are to remain open to ventilate the building.
- Mass is shorter than usual.
- There is no procession of the Gifts to the altar. Your offering will be taken as you leave the Church.
- There is no sign of peace.
- Holy Communion will be received under one kind only.
- Communion must be given silently, avoiding any physical contact.
- Please remove your mask (if wearing one) and gloves to receive Holy Communion.
- As you leave do not to linger in doorways or other 'choke points'.
- People are urged not to come to the sacristy before and after Mass, unless they are servers or sacristans.
- Face coverings are mandatory for all who are not exempt.
- The Bishops also urge readers to wear disposable gloves.
