This Sunday is the Fifth Sunday of Easter. The prayers and readings are to be found in the yellow books on page 265. The first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, describes how the Apostles decided to institute the order of deacons. In the second reading, from the first letter of Saint Peter, we are reminded that we are living stones making a spiritual house. with Christ being our cornerstone. We are called to unity, and the principle of unity is the headship of Christ. In the Gospel, from Saint John, we are told that Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life. The

Church, of which we are members is built on Him.

This Sunday, Children's Liturgy resumes at the 10am Mass.

This Sunday the National Anthem will be sung at the end of each Mass, before the final hymn, if there is one. At all Masses there will be a prayer for the King and the Royal Family in the Bidding Prayers. Prayer cards to mark the Coronation are available.

**Social dancing happens at 8pm** in the Hall on Thursday; all are welcome. On Friday the Social club meets at 1.30pm.

On Tuesday 9 May, from 7.30-8.30pm, members of the leadership teams and the clergy of the deanery parishes will be meeting in the Sacred Heart Parish Rooms in order to get to know one another and to explore the next steps in the joining together of the various parishes.

The meeting of the Finance Committee will take place on Tuesday 16 May. One thing we are hoping to do very soon is reintroduce counters and bankers, which means we would like those who did this in the past, if they are able to re-volunteer, and others to volunteer afresh. If you are approached, this means counting the collection (not every week, there would be a rota) and taking the collection to the bank. Until now Vincent has been doing this all on his own. Incidentally, the counting rota was abolished on the advice of the diocese given the mistaken idea that handling money could be a way of catching Covid. This is now known not to be the case.

On Thursday 1st June at 7pm, the Sacred Heart will host a Deanery Discipleship Mass. Following Bishop Richard's desire for collaboration between parishes, as part of his new pastoral plan, please join us for a short, uplifting celebration of the Eucharist, followed by fellowship time. Ample parking in front of Hove Town Hall - members of all parishes across the city are welcome.

The Carthusian Martyrs were the monks of the London Charterhouse, the monastery of the Carthusian Order in the City of London, who were put to death from the 4 May 1535 until the 20 September 1537. The method of execution was hanging, disembowelling while still alive and then quartering. Others were imprisoned and left to starve to death. The group also includes two monks who were brought to that house from the Charterhouses of Beauvale and Axholme and similarly dealt with. The total was 18 men, all of whom have been formally recognized by the Catholic Church as martyrs.

At the outset of the "King's Great Matter," (the euphemism given to King Henry VIII's decision to divorce Catherine of Aragon, marry Anne Boleyn and break legal ties with the Pope) the government was anxious to secure the public acquiescence of the Carthusian monks, since they enjoyed great prestige for the austerity and sincerity of their way of life. Despite their strict enclosure, the monks of the London Charterhouse were held in high esteem and had considerable influence among the people, as many used to consult the Carthusians for spiritual advice.

On 4 May 1535 the authorities sent to their death at Tyburn, Middlesex three leading English Carthusians, Fathers John Houghton, prior of the London house, Robert Lawrence and Augustine Webster, respectively priors of Beauvale and Axholme, along with a Bridgettine monk, Richard Reynolds of Syon Abbey and a secular priest John Haile. Tradition relates that when Houghton was about to be quartered, as the executioner tore open his chest to remove his heart, he prayed, "O Jesus, what wouldst thou do with my heart?"

Little more than a month later, it was the turn of three leading monks of the London house: Fathers Humphrey Middlemore, William Exmew and Sebastian Newdigate. They were bound upright in chains for 13 days before being taken to die at Tyburn, Middlesex on 19 June. Newdigate was a personal friend of Henry VIII, who twice visited him in the prison to persuade him to give in, in vain.

The next move was to seize four more monks of the community, two being taken to the Carthusian house at Beauvale in Nottinghamshire, while Father John Rochester and Father James Walworth were taken to the Charterhouse of St. Michael in Hull in Yorkshire. They were made an "example" of on 11 May 1537, when, condemned for refusing to sign the Act of Supremacy, they were hanged in chains from the York city battlements until dead.

On 18 May 1537 the 20 hermits and 18 lay brothers remaining in the London Charterhouse were required to take the Oath of Supremacy. Those refusing the oath were all sent on 29 May to Newgate Prison, and treated as had been their fellow Carthusians in June 1535. They were chained standing and with their hands tied behind them to posts in the prison. In this condition they all died, bar one, who was later executed at Tyburn.
