Tuesday 25 December, 10am: Dawn Mass. Tuesday 25 December, 11.15am: Day Mass.



This Sunday is the First Sunday of

Advent. It is the first Sunday of the liturgical year, and marks the beginning of our joyful season of waiting and anticipation as we prepare for the feast of Christmas. The first reading from the prophet Jeremiah tells of the coming of the Messiah, one who will bring honesty and integrity to the earth. Integrity is the opposite of hypocrisy: it means being completely coherent in both words, intentions and actions, wanting to do good and actually doing good as well –'talking the talk and walking the walk' in the modern phrase. In the Gospel Jesus tells us to watch and to stay awake, that is to become more aware of the spiritual aspects of our lives. In particular we are warned not to let our hearts be coarsened with debauchery, drunkenness and the cares of life. In the midst of this life's journey, we need to keep our eyes and minds on our final destination, eternal life with God.

At all Masses this Sunday we will be renewing our baptismal promises instead of reciting the Creed in the usual way. You will be asked six questions, and the answer to each is 'I do'. This is part of the preparation for Four First Holy Communion candidates.

Have you seen our new Advent Wreath? Each candle represents one of the Advent Sundays, and the wreath is a way of marking our progress towards Christmas, which is represented by the white candle in the centre. The pink candle represents Gaudete ('Rejoice') Sunday when the vestments are prose in colour rather than purple.

Today, at 4pm we will have Evening Prayer followed by the Rosary. This will be the Evening Prayer of Advent Sunday, a wonderful and liturgical way to prepare for Christmas. We will be singing the Advent hymn 'O come, o come, Emmanuel.'

Liturgical Notes:

Monday is the feast of Saint Francis Xavier. Tuesday is the feast of Saint John of Damascus. Friday is the feast of Saint Ambrose Saturday is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady.

Advent is here. Advent is the time of preparation for Christmas. It is a penitential season, and thus the vestments are purple, and there are no flowers on the sanctuary, and the organ is only used to support the singing. There is no Gloria in Advent. (The Gloria is the song of the angels at Christmas, so we are saving ourselves for that 'big' Gloria on Christmas night.) There is quite a lot to do in Advent. Here is a checklist, with activities in no particular order, for all ages:

•Build a crib. The first crib was made by Saint Francis in the year 1224 in the town of Greccio. The idea was that it would enable people to contemplate Bethlehem and the manger without having to go to the Holy Land. St Francis's crib was life-sized, but your does not have to be; all it needs to do is to bring Bethlehem into your home. When you have built your crib, please put a photo of it on the parish facebook page or the parish twitter stream.

•Make an Advent wreath for the home. There are numerous 'how to' guides on line. If you want to show off of your handiwork/provide encouragement for others, please show us a picture, as above for cribs.

- •Get a tree. The tree is green and symbolises eternal life.
- •Keep an advent calendar.
- •Go to confession. (See elsewhere in this newsletter for times.)
- •Pray more.

•Study the Scriptures. (Remember our Thursday evening on Saint Luke.)

•Think of the presents you are going to give people and the greetings you are soon going to send them. These presents do not need to be material.

Make a good resolution before January which will help build up your family life.
Above all, start looking forward to Christmas which will begin at Mass on Christmas Day or Eve. Choose now which Mass you will go to. (See elsewhere for times.)

Advent is a time when the faithful are urged to go to Confession. The sacrament of reconciliation is available at the usual times (Saturdays 10.30-11am) and in addition on Saturday 15th December, we shall have confessions all day with Adoration, from after the morning Mass until the evening Mass. Various visiting priests will be present to hear confessions: Fr Edward Burton (11am-noon); Father Ray Blake (noon-1pm) and Canon Colin Wolczak (2pm-3pm). At other times, Fr Alexander will be available. The Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will help us all to focus our minds on the coming of the Lord. If you wish to sign up for an hour of watching in front of the Blessed Sacrament, there is a list in the Sacristy.

Don't forget our other Advent initiative, namely the four sessions on St Luke's Infancy Narrative (Saint Luke, chapters one and two) on Thursdays. Don't worry if you missed the first one, you can still join. All are invited. Please bring a Bible with you.

Our diocese has a priestly ordination to look forward to. The Rev Jack Andrew Lusted is being ordained a priest through the imposition of hands of our Bishop on Wednesday 19th December at 7pm in Arundel Cathedral. Quite a few of us here have never been to an ordination, so it would be a good idea to pencil this one into our diaries now. In addition, even if we do not go, we should start to pray for Deacon Jack as he prepares to serve the people of God as a priest in this diocese. We should also be praving for vocations. Fr Alexander intends to go to the ordination. Do let him know if you would like to come too. There is an after party, and the organisers would like to have some idea of numbers.

In the meantime, our diocese has just lost a priest, Father David Goddard, who was the parish priest of West Grinstead and died on Friday 23rd November. He had been ill some time - indeed it was to his bedside that Bishop Richard was going after the induction Mass here. Fr Goddard was a former Anglican clergyman, and he leaves a wife and two children. His son is also a priest, Fr Matthew Goddard. Let us pray for them and for the repose of Fr David. The 10am Mass next Sunday will be for the repose of his soul, and his funeral arrangements will be announced in due course.

November is now behind us, and with it the month for the prayer for the dead. Let us remember, though, that we can and must pray for the Faithful Departed all through the year, and that each and every Mass is offered for the living and the dead, with a special remembrance of the departed in the Eucharistic prayer. Moreover, we need to keep in mind all those who are bereaved, who may seem happy enough on the outside but who are carrying a burden of grief. Quite a lot of parishes have a bereavement group or offer bereavement counselling (we do not vet) but it is also important to remember that the whole parish is a bereavement group, in that we are all committed to supporting the bereaved. With this in mind, on 31st December, the last day of the year, the feast of Saint Silvester, we will celebrate Mass at noon for all those who have died in the year 2018, and all those who are in mourning for the dead. At this Mass we can include the names of the dead (recent and not so recent) at the remembrance of the dead in the Eucharistic prayer. Afterwards we can go into the Hall for refreshments. Please note the date now. Furthermore, the diocese runs a course in bereavement counselling once a year. If you are interested in going to the next one. please speak to Fr Alexander.

Fr Alexander is still looking for **a manager** for the Hall. The person appointed would manage the Hall bookings, take care of the keys, clean the Hall, and be the point of contact with all those who wish to book the Hall. Ideally, he or she would live close by. If interested, please speak to Fr Alexander, who will explain the remuneration.

Day of Recollection for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Saturday 8 December: please sign the list in the sacristy so we know the numbers for lunch, which is being provided for you.

A Note on Parking. People often appeal to me to adjudicate on matters to do with parking, which I am reluctant to do, as I have no expertise in this field and do not even own a car (though happy to be driven around in other people's.) It is important to remember that illegal parking is precisely that, illegal, and for a good reason. Traffic wardens are there to enforce the law. Our neighbours are particularly keen to point out that we should do everything to ensure that parking is legal and correct. We do not want them to blame the Church for encouraging illegal parking. Indeed, we strongly discourage it. So, let us try to keep the neighbourhood happy! ALS

At the recent Parish Team meeting, we discussed ways of making the Liturgy more reverent and better organised. As part of this we are investigating the possibility of restoring our liturgical books (the Lectionaries and the Missals) which have sustained some wear and tear over the years, as well as restoration of the Paschal candlestick, some of the chalices and the processional cross. In addition, we decided that we would appoint Mass Organisers for each Mass. These organisers will have the role of keeping an eye out for all the things that need to be done before Mass and ensuring that everyone and everything is ready for the celebration of the Liturgy. It will take some time to roll out this new system, but we are grateful to Josie Staunton and Barbara Skinner for undertaking this role at 6.00pm Mass, and to Debbie Forsdyke, Brian Forsdyke and Linda Mabbott for undertaking the role at 10am. (Watch this space for the other Masses). There is a role description for the Mass Organisers which any member of the congregation can see, if they wish. Meanwhile, could we adopt the following: ten minutes before Mass begins, if vou are a reader, a server or an Extraordinary minister of the eucharist, please report to the sacristy for prayers before Mass.

Fr Alexander is away from Monday 7 January to Friday 18 January inclusive and will not be available to sign school forms on these days.
