Golden Jubilee

I was ordained a priest 50 years ago June 1968. We will mark the occasion when we gather as a Parish to celebrate our Parish Day in the grounds of Cardinal Newman School on the 8th July. We have booked the grounds at Cardinal Newman School for a marquee on **Friday 6th** for an International dinner and **Sunday 8th** for our Parish day. It will be similar to what we have had for the past 17 years celebrating the life of our Parish.

Anointing of the sick

Those who are my age will remember when this Sacrament was known as the "last Rites". People wouldn't let the priest know that the person was seriously ill until they were unconscious. In the letter of St. James we hear the words "if there is anyone sick among you they should send for the priests of the Church and they should pray over the sick person. The prayer of faith will give strength and peace to that sick person and if they have failed in any way they will be forgiven" It is a beautiful sacrament giving hope not just to the sick person but to family members too.

It will be a bit of a shock for parents and children as the schools open, some on Tuesday/Wednesday. It will be difficult to get them back to an ordered way of life just after New Year's Day. That long holiday in October has been quickly forgotten.

Seeing your life through the lens of the Gospel

- 1. What started out as an ordinary day for Joseph and Mary turned out to be a day with an encounter they would remember for a long time.
- 2. Simeon gave thanks because his eyes saw the salvation God had prepared. In what ways have you experienced God's salvation in your life: an experience of being loved, or discovering a sense of purpose in life, or being touched by the wonders of creation? Give thanks for those memories.
- 3. Simeon also acknowledged that not all would accept the light that would shine through Jesus, and this rejection would be a cause of pain to Mary. It can be a source of pain to parents, teachers, church ministers, and all who work for others when some reject values, projects, advice which would be for their good. Perhaps a sword has sometimes pierced your soul as well.
- 4. The final sentence speaks of Jesus as one who grew and became strong and was filled with wisdom. What has helped you to grow in wisdom? Have you seen others grow in wisdom through the experience of life?
