This Sunday is the Fifth Sunday in the Year. The first reading describes the vision of the prophet Isaiah, who sees the sanctuary of the Temple of the Lord filled with the Lord's glory, and the angels calling out 'Holy, holy, holy!',

words which we use as an acclamation before the most holy part of the Mass, the Eucharistic Prayer. Confronted with the goodness of God, His glory and power. Isaiah feels all his human weakness. The same is true for Saint Peter in the Gospel reading. Nevertheless, Jesus persists in calling Saint Peter, despite his weaknesses. The advice given to Saint Peter, which leads to the miraculous catch of fish, is 'Put out into deep water': as weak human beings we are called by God to put out into the deep, to go beyond our comfort zone, to use the modern phrase. With Saint Peter, the results are well known; from being a simple fisherman, he became a fisher of men, the first leader of the Church on earth.

The feast of Our Lady of Lourdes falls on Monday, so this Sunday we are having a retiring collection for the Lourdes Fund, which enables those who cannot afford it to join the diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes. Please give generously. Last year the diocese was able to disburse £60,275 of financial support to those who otherwise might not have been able to go, thanks to the 70 parishes who collected for this purpose. Bishop Richard particularly commends this collection to us. (There are envelopes for your donations.)

A warm welcome to our Guides, Brownies and Rainbows who are at the 10am Mass this Sunday for their Church Parade. As you may know, they meet regularly in our Church Hall, where we have hosted them for some time, and look forward to doing so for many many years to come!

This Thursday is Valentine's day and this week is usually designated a time for celebrating marriage. Accordingly, next Sunday, this is exactly what we shall do.

Married couples are invited to come up at the end of Mass (accompanied by their children, if possible) to receive the Nuptial Blessing. This is the prayer that was said over you on your wedding day, though you may well have forgotten its exact contents by now, and it may be useful and pleasant to hear it again in less stressful circumstances. In addition, we have some special matrimonial candles to give away as souvenirs, and signs of your matrimonial commitment. So please note the day, speak to your spouse, and come to be blessed next week.

## Liturgical notes:

February is the month dedicated to the Holy Family. On days on which there is no feast we will celebrate either a votive Mass of Our Lady or a votive Mass of Saint Joseph.

Monday is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Brace yourselves! Lent is coming. Easter is late this year, and Ash Wednesday falls on 6 th March. Not many people know this but...... The earliest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 4 February (which is only possible during a common year with Easter on 22 March), which happened in 1598, 1693, 1761 and 1818 and will next occur in 2285. The latest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 10 March (when Easter Day falls on 25 April) which occurred in 1666, 1734, 1886 and 1943 and will next occur in 2038. Ash Wednesday has never occurred on Leap Year Day (29 February), and it will not occur as such until 2096. The only other years of the third millennium that will have Ash Wednesday on 29 February are 2468, 2688, 2840 and 2992. (Ash Wednesday falls on 29 February only if Easter is on 15 April in a leap year starting on a Sunday.) [From Wikipedia]. Anyway,

even though we have some time to go, we need to start thinking about Lent before it catches up with us. We have two things planned so far:

- 1. On Friday evenings there will be Stations of the Cross at 7.30pm in Church. [This is the traditional time, but another time is possible. We can also have Stations at some point during daylight hours, if desired. Note: on Friday 5 April we have our Taizé service.]
- 2. In keeping with our Bishop's encouragement, and following on from what we did in Advent, we shall have 'Scripture Thursdays' in the Upper Room at 8pm. This will mean a consideration of the Passion Narrative of Saint Luke, as is fitting for the Year of Luke (year C) and for Lent.

Our confirmation candidates are meeting with their catechists in the Hall, this Monday at 7pm. Let us all pray for them, and do our best to encourage them in the journey they have undertaken. Confirmation Day is the 25 May!

Our parish has received another generous bequest from a deceased parishioner. Teresa Barker, whom many of you knew, has left us the sum of £2,000. This will be dedicated to the stained-glass window fund. Fr Alexander has written to Teresa's niece to thank her for sending the cheque and to assure her that we will pray for Teresa. Once more, it would be appropriate for us all to offer to Rosary for the repose of her soul.

The funeral Mass of Margaret Forrest, who died on Friday 25 January will take place here this Thursday, 14 February, at 11am. All are invited to attend. After the funeral there will be coffee, tea and cake in the Upper Room. The prayer of

committal for cremation will be made at the Church door, which is perfectly proper. Let is continue to pray for Margaret's soul and for the comfort of her two sons, Nick and Mark, and their families.

The parish has received more sad news: Tony Scannell, of Ingram Crescent, died on Wednesday 6 February, in the Martletts Hospice. His funeral will take place here at 1pm on Friday 15th February, followed by burial at Hove Cemetery. Let us pray for his soul and the comfort of his family and friends.

This Friday, 15 February, we are holding our Choir Supper for adult singers in the Hall. The purpose of this event is to thank those who sing for their commitment to this important ministry. Many comment favourably on our music. If you would like to contribute to the Choir Supper as a way of showing your gratitude, please do leave non-perishable goods in the presbytery at any convenient time, and perishable goods on the day itself.

22 February, which is a Friday, is the feast of the Chair (or See) of Saint Peter. This year the feast does not fall within Lent, and given that we are under the patronage of Saint Peter, we are going to hold the parish quiz on that day in the Hall. This will start at 7.00pm. Tickets (£4/£1 u12) are on sale this weekend and next, or put your name down to reserve tickets if you haven't got the money this week? All proceeds are going to the Chestnut Tree Hospice, which is one of our parish charities.

Because we have moved the statue of Saint Peter from the alcove at the back of the Church, we now have an empty space there in the months when the crib

is not up. (This space was originally built as the baptistry.) What could we do with the 'new' space? One idea is to hang a picture of a saint in the alcove and make it a shrine. Are there any suggestions? One possibility is a picture of Our Lady (though we already have a statue); or perhaps a saint who is associated with one of the countries from which many of our parishioners hail. This could be Saint Charbel the Miracle-Worker, who is deeply revered in Syria, Lebanon and Mexico; or Saint Januarius, the patron of Naples; or even Saint Blaise, whose Blessing so many of us received last week: or Saint Patrick... the list is endless. Or perhaps Padre Pio? Getting a decent image of a Saint is not hard, we would just have to agree on the saint, which might be more difficult. Please give it some thought, and make your feelings known.

Fr Alexander writes: Last week the Bishop said the following to us in his pastoral letter: "As we look to the future, then, let us be confident. There will be difficulties along the way, for we are called to take up the Cross, but it is the Lord's work that we are doing and His strength will always be far greater than our fears, worries and concerns. Let us, as individuals and as a community of Faith, be people of action. May we all be open to the changes that will be necessary for the work that lies ahead." As we all know, the diocese is entering into a period of re-organisation, as laid out in the Pastoral Plan, which is all in the public domain. This means some places of worship will close, parishes will be amalgamated, and the Mass times in the Hove and Brighton area will be rearranged and rationalised. This will have an impact on us here at Saint Peter's, so let us take the Bishop's words to heart.

## **CCRS** Course coming to the Diocese:

In support of Bishop Richard's Pastoral Plan, the Diocese is planning the launch of a CCRS course, starting in September 2019. The Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies has been established since 1991 and aims to provide an introduction to Catholic theology and give an understanding of the central truths of our Faith. It will be open to teachers working in Catholic schools, Catechists, people involved in pastoral and liturgical work and other interested adults.
