Fr Alexander writes (repeated from last week): Last week the Bishop said the following to us in hispastoral letter: "As we look to the future, then, let us be confident. This means some places of worship will close, parishes will be amalgamated, and the Mass times in the Hove and Brighton area will be rearranged

Please remember that while every effort is made to assign a Mass intention to the day requested, this is not always possible. In addition, a Mass intention may be moved if a funeral Mass is booked on that day. The intention for the Holy Souls is funded from the donations made to the collection box at the back of the Church. RIP means 'rest in peace' and that the person has died. GE means 'good estate' and that we are praying for the well-being of a living person. In addition to the named intention, every Mass is offered for all the living and all the dead.

This Sunday is the Sixth Sunday in the Year. The first reading today, taken from the prophecy of Jeremiah, tells us what it means to have faith in the Lord, and how this trust in the Lord sustains a soul through good times and bad. The Gospel is the 'Sermon on the Plain' from Saint Luke (as opposed to the Sermon on the Mount, which is found in Saint Matthew) in which Jesus contrasts the happiness of those who have faith, with the unhappy lot of those who trust in themselves.

This Sunday has been designated Racial Justice Sunday, a day on which we are invited to think about matters to do with racial justice and to pray for an end to prejudice and injustice in these matters. The theme this year is "Dignity for all workers", recognising the problems faced by people due to racism and ethnic discrimination in the workplace. Our Bishops write: "In a world steeped in violence, conflict, and discrimination, the Gospel demands that we acknowledge the dignity of the human person, the necessity of building peace, prosperity, justice for all. In Octogesima Adveniens and Gaudium et Spes, St Paul VI teaches that "all people have a right to work ... to lead a worthy life on the material, social, cultural and spiritual level":. We are therefore called to ensure people are not exploited while they work, and to open our hearts to those who face this hatred."

This week is usually designated a time for celebrating marriage. Married couples are invited to come up at the end of Mass (accompanied by their children, if possible) to receive the Nuptial Blessing. Many congratulations to them all, especially those celebrating important anniversaries.

Liturgical notes:

February is the month dedicated to the Holy Family. On days on which there is no feast we will celebrate either a votive Mass of Our Lady or a votive Mass of Saint Joseph.

Friday is the feast of the Chair (or See) of Saint Peter. This feast celebrates the relic that is enclosed in the reliquary designed by Bernini in the apse of Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome: inside the reliquary is an ancient chair said to have been the throne of Saint Peter himself, the first Pope. The Chair represents the authority of the Pope, and the mission of Saint Peter and his successors to preside over the universal Church, the whole assembly of charity. Because this Church is dedicated to Saint Peter, this feast is of special significance to us here. Saturday is the feast of Saint Polycarp. bishop and martyr.

On Saturday 9 February we held our session on Welcoming, and how to be a more welcoming community. There was a session of Biblical reflection, and then there was a practical discussion. While every church aims to be welcoming, nevertheless, we need to make sure we are welcoming with more than words. So, we asked ourselves how we can create a warm and welcoming atmosphere at St Peter's. Here are some of the practical points we came up with.

1. We need to know each other's names. Name badges are a good idea on special occasions

such as Parish Day. On other occasions we need to ask people their names, and of course, make a huge effort to remember them. One easy way to put names to faces is via the parish facebook page. Please do consider joining this, or joining fb just to join the group. (In a few decades there will be no parish newsletters, only electronic communication.)

- 2. We need to promote social events, such as coffee after Mass, film nights, the quiz, social dancing, and evening and day activities in the Hall. Not everyone wants to come to these, but when we go, let us make an effort to make friends with people who we do not know, rather than stick to those we have known for ages; let us remember we are not a warm group that is closed to strangers.
- 3. We need to give the right vibe in Church: smile, make eye contact, don't be anxious about meeting strangers, show a warm welcome to children in particular. If anyone looks uncomfortable, lost, or in difficulty, give them the reassurance they need and show that you are happy they are there, and ready to help if needed.
- 4. Welcomers perform an important 'front of house' role giving our newsletters and so on, but the whole community is there to welcome people, and everyone is involved in being welcoming.
- 5. A few practical points were raised. We need better coffee, including decaff, and we need better loos in the Hall. The Hall is going to be refurbished in the next few years, as will the loo opposite the Presbytery kitchen. But the important point remains: our facilities should reflect the care and attention we devote to making people welcome.
 6. Inclusion is essential. No one should feel left out. The Mass organisers will ask members of the congregation to take up the gifts, for example. If you don't want to, that is fine, but if you can, that is great.
- 7. This is pretty obviously an international Church. We need to mark this in practical ways, such as the International dinner. We then talked about the pictures to hang in the space occupied by the crib at Christmas, which could reflect this.

8. If you have any questions about this, please do not hesitate to ask them. We will look to continue this conversation.

Brace yourselves! Lent is coming. Ash Wednesday falls on 6 March. We have two things planned so far: 1. On Friday evenings there will be Stations of the Cross at 7.30pm in Church. Note: on Friday 5 April we have our Taizé service.

2. In keeping with our Bishop's encouragement, and following on from what we did in Advent, we shall have 'Scripture Thursdays' in the Upper Room at 8pm. This will mean a consideration of the Passion Narrative of Saint Luke, as is fitting for the Year of Luke (year C) and for Lent.

In addition, you might like to think now before Lent overtakes us all - just what you personally are going to do for Lent. One usually gives something up, and takes something up: the giving up could be some luxury food, smoking, or alcohol; the taking up could be an act of charity, or more prayer. In addition, everyone should make a huge effort to go to Confession in Lent. We shall have a day of Confessions with Adoration on Saturday 30 March from 10.30am to 5.30am, with lots of visiting priests (we hope). We also have various First Reconciliation services for those preparing for First Holy Communion and their families. In addition, we shall have Confessions available every Friday evening from 7pm to 7.30pm before Stations of the Cross. In the meantime, please give this a bit of thought.

Have you bought your ticket for our Quiz on 22 February, this Friday, the feast of the Chair (or See) of Saint Peter? This will start at 7.30pm. All proceeds are going to the Chestnut Tree Hospice, which is one of our parish charities. All are welcome, please bring your all friends.

World Day of Prayer: WDP will be held in the Methodist Church, Portland Road on Friday 1 March at 10.30am. This year's service has been prepared by Christian women of Slovenia and the theme is 'Come, everything is ready'. Christians in over 170 Countries

will be celebrating the same service on the same day around the globe. A group of women from the various Churches in Hove will be presenting the service. There will be refreshments served afterwards so a chance to meet Christians from other denominations. We only have one representative from St Peter's so if anyone would like to help next year please contact Mary Morrison 07592000061.

Last week you all had a chance to see the work in progress on the stained glass. The finished work will be unveiled on Saturday 1 June at the 6pm Mass, at which we shall be joined by our specially invited guest, Fr Jerry! Please note the date now.
