This Sunday is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The first reading tells us that Jesus bring true justice to the world; in the Gospel we have Saint Luke's account of His baptism in the River Jordan by John. Jesus's baptism announces the beginning of His public ministry, and the occasion on which God the Father declares that He is the

Beloved Son with whom He is well pleased. This feast marks the end of the Christmas season, and the start of ordinary Time and the Sundays of the Year. The vestments will be green next Sunday.

If you did not get one last week, please make sure you take a copy of the leaflet from the Bishop which is entitled THE WORD WHO IS LIFE and which concerns the Pastoral Plan for the future of the Diocese. Please read it very carefully and keep it for future reference. See elsewhere in this week's newsletter for some thoughts about how what we are being asked to do will impact on this parish in particular.

Note on Mass intentions: every effort is made to celebrate the intention on the preferred day, but this is not always possible. In the case of anniversaries and other special days, you are advised to book well in advance. In case where a preferred day is not available, the Mass intention will be celebrated on the nearest free day. When a funeral takes place the mass intention for that day will be rescheduled to the next available day. The intention 'Holy Souls' means that this Mass is being celebrated for the Holy Souls in Purgatory thanks to contributions made to the box in Church marked 'Holy Souls'.

Liturgical notes:

Fr Alexander is away until Friday this week and is very grateful to Canon Daithi Foley for celebrating the daily Masses, and to Canon Oliver Heaney for celebrating the Sunday Masses in his absence. I am sure you will give both Canons a warm welcome. Please note that there is no Mass on Monday, regrettably.

This Friday the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity begins, which runs until

the 25 January, the feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. During the Octave, whenever there is no feast, we shall celebrate the Mass for the Unity of Christians.

January is the month dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus.

THE WORD WHO IS LIFE

Fr Alexander writes: I hope you have all had a chance to study the Bishop's leaflet about the future of the diocese as it faces a declining number of priests for the foreseeable future. Back in October the Bishop visited this deanery and explained that the Hove and Southwick parishes will at a future date be doing more things together. But he did not just talk of merging parishes, he also talked of the theme of developing lay people to become more involved in the mission of the Church. This is the main thrust of the leaflet that you have been given. The first key idea is Formation - that is, what is often termed continuing education or adult education. Our formation as Christians does not stop at Confirmation. but should be a continuous and lifelong process. In this parish, adult education happens through the weekly and daily sermons, and through this newsletter, which are both catechetical tools. It also happens via Bible study. In Advent we did four sessions on the first two chapters of St Luke, which tell of the birth of Christ. We will continue this theme, by looking at St Luke's Passion narrative during Lent. Everyone is welcome to come and these sessions are not hard or intimidating, but meant to be interesting and fun.

The Bishop also talks of a 'renewed spirit of welcome in parish and deanery'. We all believe that we should be a welcoming community, but how? We are going to explore what this means and how to do it

more effectively on Saturday 9 February, from 10.30am-1pm. Do come along if you would like to be a parish welcomer: and we are all called to welcome others, so all are invited; so do come even if you do not want to have a formal welcoming role. We also have a session for readers on Saturday 26 January 10.30am-1pm, which should be of interest to all readers and all who care about the proclamation of the Word. Finally, the Bishop mentions 'living your life centred on the Eucharist and prayer' - we certainly need to develop our appreciation of the Mass. our Eucharistic Adoration (we have a day chalked up for Lent, with confessions), and our ability to pray, and these will be topics for future development, perhaps after Easter. More on this topic next week.

Many thanks to all those who brought Christmas presents to the parish for distribution to the housebound. These are being taken to them and bringing much joy and happiness in the process, you will be glad to know.

People have commented favourably on the 'new' position of the statue of our patron saint, Saint Peter. For this reason the Saint can stay where he is when the crib is dismantled.
